General County F. A. Meetings

General meetings of the County Federations of Agriculture will be held this month and it is expected that Mr. A. H. Turner, Secretary of the Canadian Agricultural Prices Support Board will address the gatherings.

The Queen's County meeting will be held at Hunter River on Wednesday, June 21, under the presidency of Mr. Earle Ing, Mount Herbert. On the following day the Prince County Federation will meet at Summerside with the President, Mr. Charles Yeo, Sherbrooke, in the chair. The King's County meeting will be held at either Cardigan or Montague on Friday, June 23 with the president, Mr. Wilfred MacDonald, Brudenell presiding.

Details and operations of the proposed potato marketing boards will be reviewed at these meetings. General discussion on agricultural matters and organizations will take place as part of a program that has not yet been completed.

New Honors For Dr. Lantz Cow

In the herd of Dr. J. P. Lantz at Charlottetown, the Jersey cow, Keppoch Double Carmen has completed a 5 year old record of 3,039 lbs. of milk and 472 lbs. of fat, in 365 days.

Keppoch Jester's Beauty in 263 days has produced 7,708 lbs. of milk and 469 lbs. of fat, with a test of over 6.00% as a senior four year old. The former is a grand-daughter and the latter a daughter of Brampton Jester's Standard 2nd, a famous bull that was used for several years on Prince Edward Island.

Incidentally, gossip has it around the Head Office of the Canadian Jersey Cattle Club that in a survey of breeders on the American continent, and a vote taken, that the cow that wins the honours of being acclaimed the greatest brood cow of the Jersey breed of all time, is the dam of Brampton Jester's Standard 2nd, known as Jester's Royal Maid.

This will be welcome news to Dr. Lantz who has for several years been concentrating on the blood of this sensational cow, and in the bull that he recently purchased last year in the United States is a concentration once again of the blood of this world famous matron.

Attended Maritime Art Ass'n Meeting

Miss Frances Johnston, director of the Children's Art Centre was elected Prince Edward Island's Vice-President of the Maritime Art Association in Saint John, N. B. on Friday, May 26th.

Attending as representative of the P. E. I. Arts and Crafts Guild, Miss Johnston was accompanied by Mrs. P. A. Creelman, who represented the P. E. I. Art Society.

Representatives from 22 art clubs in the Maritime Provinces were present at the conference which lasted for two days. A feature of the conference was the address by Avery Shaw, art curator at the New Brunswick Museum, in which he stated that the preservation of standards is the ultimate function of the modern museum. To illustrate the importance of preservation he said that "the peaks in human artistic effort should be available to developing creative talent, so that it may be conscious of the mark at which to shoot."

Miss Johnston spoke on "The Arts and Life", and commented on the relation of the artist to society, of society to art, the position of the Canadian artist today, and the source of the creative urge.

Officers elected for the coming year were as follows: President, Mr. Lauren Harris, head of the department of fine art at Mount Allison University, Vice-President, P. E. I., Miss Frances Johnston, N.S. Donald MacKay, N. B. C. H. Fosse.

During the conference, President Harris commended the radio art classes afforded rural P. E. I. under the sponsorship of the Arts and Crafts Guild.

the room: "Isn't it a fact that Trygve Lie is a known Communist and that he is behind a movement to seat the Chinese Communists in the United Nations?"

Rankin also alleged that the U. N. is interfering in the internal affairs of the United States.

Acheson said that no one in the Government has questioned Lie's good faith. The rest of his answer to Rankin was lost in the general hubbub, with both men talking at the same time.

After the session, a number of legislators praised the Secretary's speech, while Senator Joseph McCarthy (Rep. Wis.), a chief critic of Acheson, told reporters: "The Red Dean of Washington is still in form."

Contrary to some expectations, the meat of Acheson's report was in his prepared address, not in his answers to questions, which were mainly repetitions of what he had already said. In these answers, which were not permitted to be quoted directly, Acheson did coin one phrase in support of his general argument for unity and strength of the West. With unlimited strength, he said, the West will not provoke war by weakness.

Discusses London Meetings

In his speech, Acheson went at great length into the London meetings. He drew applause when he said the Foreign Ministers of the North Atlantic countries had agreed that they needed "adequate forces" for defence against Soviet Communism.

The whole theme of the address was that the Western Powers must get closer together in their economic, political, and military operations than they now are.

Acheson made a reference to Canada when he noted that a study is being made in the United States to discover the adjustments necessary to achieve a balance in American international accounts.

"The Canadian Government has been actively considering these problems from its point of view, and the O.E.E.C. (Organization for European Economic Co-operation) countries have been steadily working on this same range of problems in their organization," he said.

After conversations with L. B. Pearson, Canada's External Affairs Minister, and Dr. P. U. Stikler, Netherlands' Foreign Minister, it was decided, Acheson said, that a new working relationship among Canada, the United States and O. E. E. C. "would be a desirable means for working out solutions of common economic problems."

Time For Decision

Acheson spoke with great enthusiasm of the London meetings where he met the British and French Foreign Ministers and also

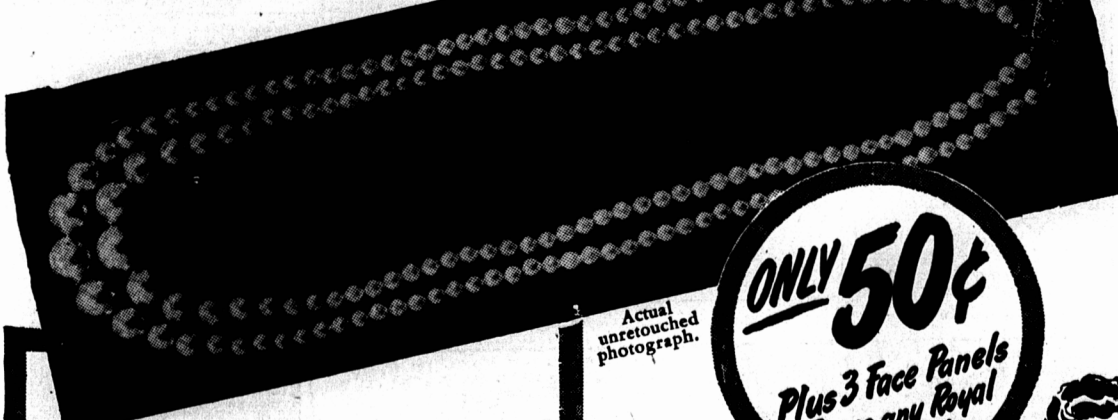
