Egg and Poultry Marketing Report

"The production of eggs in Prince Edward Island remains steady", reports Mr. F. M. Nash, district inspector of poultry products. "The quality of receipts received is only fair and the percentage of undergrades is on the increase. Although the market has eased slightly, there is no accumulation of eggs on dealers floors and the product is moving freely to Maritime and Newfoundland points."

"Operators of grading stations are now quoting producers for ungraded eggs Grade A Large 31-2, A Medium 29-30, B 23, C 16-18. Dealers are quoting for the graded pack fob country station Grade A Large 35, A Medium 33 B 23, C 16 and quoting retailers for the same pack AL 39, AM 37, B 33, C 20. Retailers are quoting consumers for the graded pack A Large 46-9, A Medium 46, B 40-2."

"Receipts of poultry at processing stations are on the increase, notably fowl. Prices remain unchanged and dealers are quoting producers delivered broilers live over 3 lbs. 25, dressed 2 1-2 lbs. and over MFA 33. Fowl live six pounds and over 21."

"The production of eggs in the Province during the months of January to April inclusive was somewhat lower than the same period in 1949. Production of eggs in May this year was 28 per cent higher than for May last year. This increase has about offset the lower production of the early part of the year and at this date the total production of eggs is within 4 per cent of 1949."

"Lower production in the early part of the year is attributed to the disinclination of poultrymen to purchase high price feeds to keep their birds into production or heavy lay during the months when housing was necessary. Increased production in May is believed due to hens being allowed out on range supplementing their ration with food supplied by the range."

Feeding Methods

"The above assumption is borne out by the reduction in the quality of May farm receipts due in the main to the heavy consumption of grasses and weeds found on range. Granted, with a drop of 19 per cent in egg prices and an increase of 10 per cent in feed prices since last May, there is not much incentive to purchase feeds to keep birds into heavy lay, however, if we are to continue in the poultry business, efficiency of operation must be practiced."

"It is known that the feeding of unbalanced rations and in quantities not sufficient for heavy lay or allowing hens to supplement their feed requirements from the range, egg production and the quality of the product suffers, whereas if birds are fed a balanced ration in sufficient quantities, production and the quality of the product increases. Cost of production is reduced or kept at a minimum by high average production per bird and the high quality of the product produced."

"The point being raised is that feed can be purchased but if improperly used, the value of same can be lost. Is it not possible that more and better feed combined with good poultry husbandry, although feed is high in price, will give you a better return on your investment? With the price of undergrade eggs being quoted at prices 10 to 15 cents under Grade A eggs, perhaps it is time for us

Business Session At Press Meeting

QUEBEC, June 8 — (CP) — Colonel the Hon. John J. Astor, chairman of the Times Publishing Company, Limited, London, England, today presided over the first business session of the seventh Imperial Press Conference.

Col. Astor, chairman of the fourth, fifth and sixth conferences, was elected by acclamation today. He has been president and chairman of the council of the Empire Press Union since 1929.

At their meeting today, the only business session of the delegates' three-day stay here, an agenda was drafted in which part of the Ottawa sessions, June 14-17 were put aside for discussion of "Freedom Of The Press."

Col. Astor, who is president of the London Press Club, was elected on a motion proposed by Senator W. Rupert Davies and seconded by Lord Burnham, director of the Daily Telegraph, London, Eng.

Senator Davies, publisher of the Kingston, Ont. Whig-Standard and chairman of the Canadian section of the Empire Press Union, was elected vice-president of the conference by acclamation.

The delegates, from 14 Commonwealth countries including Canada, attended a luncheon tendered by the city of Quebec.

At its business session the delegates adopted rules of procedure and set up committees that will function throughout the conference which ends officially in Toronto June 27 at a farewell dinner.

Among the subjects to be discussed at the Ottawa sessions are "Commonwealth Press Communications" and "Colonial Press Laws", "Training For Journalists" and "Freedom Of The Press."

Transport Minister Chevrier will address the delegates at the June 14 session on the subject of "Press Communications."

Ontario Girl Dies In Vain Rescue Attempt

NIAGARA FALLS, Ont., June 8 — (CP) — Arline Waugh, 16, gave her life today in a vain attempt to save her five-year-old sister, Fanny, from their burning home.

Eleven other members of the family survived the fire that leveled the four-room stucco cottage in adjacent Stamford township.

The mother, Mrs. Hazel Waugh, 36, a son, Kenneth, 12, and a daughter, Sylvia, 7, suffered severe burns and were taken to hospital.

The fire, believed to have started in the living-room, lashed

through the dwelling about 3 a.m. Six boys, ranging in age from 14 years to 18 months, escaped through a bedroom window. Three girls, who had been sleeping in a room at the front of the house, fled through another window. The parents and Gwen, aged one month, made their way out the side door.

Arline pulled Sylvia and 10-year-old Sharon to safety and then realized that Fanny was still in the blazing cottage. She dashed through the front door, leading to the living-room, and plunged into a wall of flame. Her body was found just two feet inside the doorway.

One of the boys, Donald, 13, suggested the fire might have started from a cigaret he had seen his mother smoking in the living-room.
