Toronto: Market narrowly higher in light trading.

New York: Stocks higher in general recovery.

Montreal: Trading light, market firm.

Toronto: Hog prices: grade A \$28.25; sows \$20; stags \$15 a hundredweight on a dressed-weight basis.

New York: Cotton closed 60 cents to \$1.15 a bale higher.

Wednesday to post a moderate advance which snapped a four-session losing streak.

Western oils had the best index gain, up 1 1/2 points. Golds and base metals had minor advances.

Senior base metals inched ahead in light trading while lower-priced mines were mixed. Advocate lost 20 cents at \$3.30, a 1957 low, but there were few other prominent price changes.

Western oils were led by Bailey Seburn's 30-cent climb to \$10.75. Central Del Rio added 30 cents at \$7.70 and a few other issues gained 10-15 cents.

Index gains: Industrials .54 to 423.69; golds .28 to 76.23; base metals .01 to 163.62; western oils 1.39 to 149.05.

MONTREAL

MONTREAL (CP)—The Montreal and Canadian stock exchanges Wednesday closed light trading on a mixed tone. Royalite fell 1 1/2 to a new low of 15 1/2 and International Nickel gained 1 1/2 at 73 1/2. Aluminium dropped 1/2 to 33 1/2 and Pacific Petroleum rose 1/2 to 23 1/2. Inter-fractionally mixed. Power corporation slipped 1/2 to 54 while Calgary Power at 60 1/2 and Galtney Power at 28 1/2 each improved 1/2. In the beverages, Canadian Breweries dropped 1/2 to 24 1/2 and Hiram-Walker gained that much at 70. Penny issue movements were mostly losses of a few cents, but (Continued on page 19)
