Opening lead—ace of clubs.
I am in receipt of a communication from a Toledo, O., reader which refers to the accompanying hand and the indicated bidding. The letter requested me to comment on bidding.

Now I am not prone to sputter when asked to comment about something, but this request did tax my sense of equanimity. Along with the letter came an explanation of each bid made, and all I can do is repeat the reasons given for the bidding sequence, without seriously attempting either to justify or criticize them.

The one club and one spade bids are reasonable enough, but North's jump reverse to three hearts does stretch matters a little bit.

South's four club is incomprehensible by ordinary standards, but the explanation offered by South was that it was a cuebid designed to show control of the suit. Whatever its purpose, and whether or not there is any sense to it, it is clear that North was not bright enough to catch on, judging from his leap to six clubs, which was also somewhat adventurous.

There the matter rested until West doubled. Then the lady sitting South, conscience-stricken by the unpleasant development, essayed six hearts. This belated heart preference did not strike a responsive chord, especially after West doubled again, and North, decided to salvage what he could by bidding seven clubs.

East then stepped into the act by doubling, feeling left out of things, what with all the surrounding activity that was going on. South thereupon decided to rescue herself from the impending holocaust and branched into seven spades.

This became the final contract, doubled, and West opened the ace of clubs. Declarer had no trouble at all making 13 tricks, and victory proved triumphant.

My correspondent informs me that the lady who sat South, and was partnered with her husband, almost invariably wins top score in the group with which she plays regularly. I am waiting for a sample of the bidding style employed by the others in the group.

Connolly Laments Halifax Port Fate

OTTAWA (CP) — Senator Harold Connolly said Thursday he regrets that the "great Atlantic port of Halifax, indispensable in war, should be so expendable in peace."

Halifax and Nova Scotia would be in a "pitiful" condition, he said, if ever defence expenditures are cut drastically and Halifax port revenues deteriorate.

The Nova Scotia Liberal spoke in the Senate on a motion urging greater use of the Atlantic area ports and the closing of St. Lawrence River ports from Nov. 15 to April 15—a measure to reduce the impact of St. Lawrence Seaway shipping on Halifax and other Atlantic harbors.

Monty Meets Reds' Leader

MOSCOW (Reuters) — Field Marshal Viscount Montgomery discussed world issues for more than two hours with Premier Nikita Khrushchev Wednesday and, at his own request, was granted another interview today.

Khrushchev's agreement to receive an unofficial visitor for long talks the second consecutive day is virtually unprecedented. Western diplomats could not recall any similar case.

Montgomery's arrival here Tuesday for a self-appointed Moscow "reconnaissance" of three days coincided with a controversial television interview, filmed in advance in Britain and shown on the CBS television network in the United States Tuesday night. In it he declared American leadership has been "suspect" for several years and that "leadership is passing to the British."

RED CARPET TREATMENT
Whatever the Westerner reaction to the interview, Montgomery received red-carpet treatment from the Russians.

He said his interview with Khrushchev, lasting two hours and 15 minutes, was conducted in an "excellent atmosphere, and Montgomery later went to the Soviet Army officers club for a "most genial" two-hour lunch in his honor, attended by Red Army men. Guests included Gen. Alexei Antonov, chief of staff of the Warsaw Pact forces.

The 71-year-old field marshal spent the afternoon sightseeing,
