Victoria Lodge Freemasons To Celebrate Centennial

Rounding off a century of Masonic activity in Charlottetown, the members of Victoria Lodge No. 2, A.F. and A.M. will convene in special session at the Masonic Temple on Sunday at 3.00 p.m. Worshipful Master Keith MacKinnon presiding.

The special speaker for the occasion will be Bro., Rev. Canon J. T. Ibbot, Rector of St. Paul's Anglican Church, Charlottetown. Invited guests include E. R. Stetson, Most Worshipful Grand Master of Masons in P. E. Island.

The Centennial dinner and dance at the Charlottetown Hotel at 6.30 p.m. on Monday will have as chief speaker Most Worshipful Bro. (Rev.) Donald MacLean Sinclair, Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Nova Scotia, who was born at Belfast, P. E. Island in 1899 and is a former minister of Valleyfield, P.E.I. United Church.

EARLY RECORDS Although Victoria Lodge celebrates one hundred years of Masonic activity, it must be noted that the earliest records of the Craft in this province can be traced to May 29, 1781 when the Brethren of H.M. Independent Company, stationed on the Island of St. John, were granted a travelling dispensation to operate a lodge known as "St. George's". After a short stay on the Island they were transferred to Halifax.

On Oct. 19th, 1787, a warrant was issued from Halifax, authorizing Ebenezer Nicolson, Master, William Hillman, Senior Warden and Robert Lee as Junior Warden to form a lodge of Free and Accepted Masons at the house of Alexander Richardson or elsewhere, in Charlottetown. These officers and nine brethren formed the charter membership of St. John's Lodge No. 562, on the registry of the Grand Lodge of England.

The house of Alexander Richardson was known as the "Cross Keys" and stood on the north-east corner of Queen and Dorchester Streets.

VICTORIA CHARTER Early records of Victoria Lodge indicate that a meeting of Master Masons was held at the residence of Bro. Past Master J. W. Morrison on Nov. 19, 1857 to take into consideration the propriety of establishing a lodge of Freemasons under the jurisdiction of the Most Worshipful, The Grand Lodge of Scotland.

The charter was granted in Edinburgh, Scotland on August 2nd, 1858 and was signed by the M.W. Grand Master, Grand Lodge of Scotland, Duke of Athol.

At an emergency meeting of Victoria Lodge on Sept. 18, 1858, the charter was read for the first time and the newly organized lodge became an active unit in Masonry under the number 383 on the Grand Lodge of Scotland, duly constituted.

GRAND LODGE FORMED On the formation of the Grand Lodge of Mason in P. E. Island at Summerside on June 24th., 1875, Saint John's Lodge was designated No. 1 and Victoria No. 2. The Grand officers were installed by the M.W. Grand Master and officers of the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick. The first Grand Master was John Yeo of Alexandria Lodge, Port Hill and B. Wilson Higgs of Victoria Lodge was the first Grand Secretary.

Bro. Yeo, later better known as Hon. Senator Yeo, continued as Grand Master for 14 years.

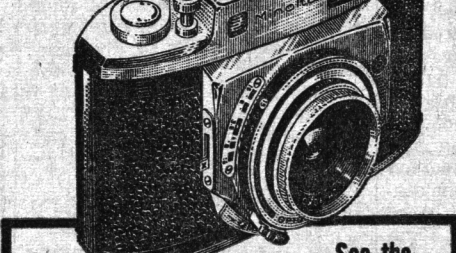
