Provincial Government Budgets For Huge Deficit

Prince Edward Island government has budgeted for a deficit of \$70,330.12 on ordinary accounts, Premier Thane A. Campbell told the Legislature yesterday tabling the 1936 estimates.

Ordinary expenditures were estimated at \$1,709,597 against ordinary revenues which are expected to be \$1,639,266.88.

Capital expenditures were estimated at \$186,500 against capital revenues expected to be \$149,885 including interest on Sinking Fund. Capital revenue estimated provide "blank cheques" for purchase of a site for a National Park, establishment of a jail farm, and for unemployment relief projects. The deficit on ordinary and capital expenditure for the current year will amount to between \$300,000 and \$400,000.

Funeral Of The Late Winnifred S. MacLeod

The funeral of the late Nursing Sister Winnifred Grace MacLeod was held yesterday from St. James Church, where members of the Overseas Nurses, Canadian Legion, Ladies Auxiliary of the Legion, and Daughters of the Empire gathered to pay final tribute to one who during her lifetime had played an honorable part in giving of her time and strength as a nursing sister in the Great War.

The silver grey casket draped with the Union Jack and a wreath of poppies rested during the service under the regimental colours draped in mourning for the sovereign she had served so well.

Rev. Dr. R. Moorhead Legate conducted the service and expressed the feeling of all her friends when he said: "We are laying to rest all that is mortal of one to whom we can sincerely apply the words of Holy Scripture, 'I have fought the good fight, I have finished my course, I have kept the faith. Henceforth there is laid up for me a crown of righteousness. It would be presumption on my part to attempt to rehearse the qualities of character which you, who knew her, esteemed so highly. But this I can do, and it is due to her that I should do so; I can voice the need of praise which she so worthily earned as a nursing-sister in the King's army during the Great War."

The presence of the Canadian Legion here today is evidence of the distinguished service which she rendered in that honourable capacity; and that, as her comrades, are giving her so far as they can, a soldier's funeral. Although she served on my front the exigencies of war did not give me the privilege of meeting her. But well I know the experiences of peril and hardship through which she passed. In areas of sea infested with the deadly submarine around Salonica, Egypt and Palestine and France, where nursing sisters had no better chance of escaping a hideous death than soldiers had, where women's lives hung by a thread from day to day as the men's did—there she served, and served honourably and well. My comrades of the Legion will bear me out when I say that never can we forget the noble, unselfish service of the brave band of nursing sisters, of whom she was a conspicuous member. Away from home and relatives and friends, wounded or sick and lonely at heart, those patient, courageous, cheerful women brought to the suffering soldier the very touch of home tenderness that his heart longed for. Their name liveth for evermore. Nursing Sister Winnifred MacLeod has graven her name deep on the record of signal military service, and on the long list of eminent Prince Edward Islanders. And so we lay her to rest, with the gracious light of Easter-tide shining upon her casket, with the promise of glorious resurrection, and the Master's word of welcome: 'Well done, good and faithful servant, enter thou into the joy of thy Lord.'

The congregation led by the choir sang two favourite hymns, "The Lord's My Shepherd" and "Abide With Me." Bugler Smith sounded The Last Post.

In passing she leaves to mourn Jack R. in Hubbard, Sask., Kenneth, Boston, Mass., Arthur Thomas, Ont., Mrs. Wm. Dalrymple, St. Thomas, Ont., Claire and David in Charlottetown.
