The following are awards which might be of interest:  
QMHC Scholarship  
 QMHC is offering substantial grants for travel and education in postgraduate areas. You

must be planning to follow studies in the field of housing. Deadline: November 30.

Elizabeth Cousins Large Memorial Trust

These are scholarships for students entering the Junior or Senior year in Home Economics or to graduate students entering study in HOME Economics or a related field. The criteria for this scholarship will be superior academic standing combined with a demonstrated

concern for others. Deadline: October 15.

UPEI Alumni Association Scholarships

Applicants must be full time students in Senior year carrying at least a normal load of five courses per semester and scheduled to graduate in May 1982. This will be awarded on the basis of academic performance and financial need.

Deadline: October 19.
