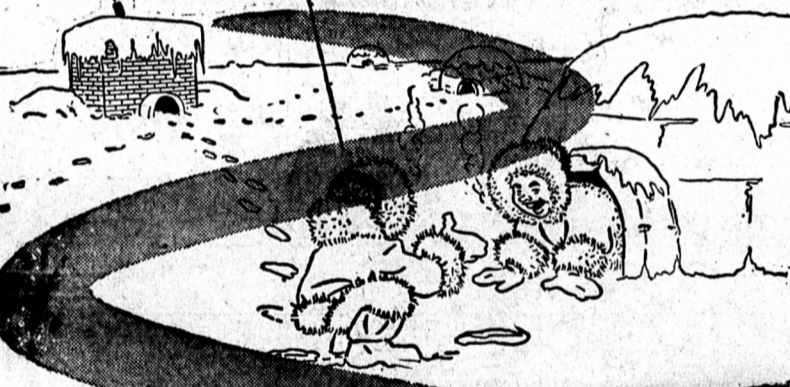
Following is the address:
