Duck Trainor, Tommy Spencer Signed To Fight

There are two ways of judging the calibre of a fighter; See him in action or look at his record Either way Don "Duck" Trainor stands out among the top welterweights of the Maritimes. A ring stylist, Duck will attempt to keep the Maritime Welterweight title on P. E. I. when he climbs into the ring with Tommy "Gun" Spencer, capable two fisted ring craftsman from New Waterford, N. S. in a ten round co-feature on the Henry Jordan — Gil Edwards card here on July the 24th.

Spencer the 29 year old veteran is no stranger to local boxing fans. P. E. I. fans still recall two summers ago, when the Tommy "Gun" delighted fistic fans at the Charlottetown Forum with a rare display of ring skill and speed in outpointing this City's Harry "Kid" Poulton, it was hoped that Spencer could be brought back to box against a suitable local boxer.

Understandably, at that time, Duck Trainor was not interested or ready for such a bout. He had just started his boxing career, after being in the ring for only three years. He was still green and certainly in no shape to meet a fighter who had twice beaten Harry Poulton and was rated among the sharpest and smartest in the game.

That was two summers ago. Since then, boxing every day, looking forward to an active indoor season, possibly in Paterson, N. J., Trainor has had a change of heart. He has gained an abundance of experience in fighting in New York and training in Paterson and Toronto with Vince Martinez, Fritze Pruden and Gus Rubicini. So he is eager to fight any body, especially Claude Fortin or Rocky Brisebois, Canada's welter champ.

But before he can hope to get within punching distance of Fortin or Brisebois, Duck Trainor will have to prove himself against tougher opponents than the men he defeated so far in his ring career.

With this in mind, Ivan Doherty has secured a match for him with Tommy Spencer. A popular fighter, Spencer is in constant demand in Eastern Canada. Moreover, his manager is demanding a much higher guarantee to meet Trainor than he accepted for a match with Poulton.

Down Cape Breton and Halifax way the feeling is that Spencer has ten years pro-experience has too much ring savvy for Trainor. These ten years included a three year tour of New England and Canadian centres, against such opponents as Billy Happler, Ross Virgo (U. S. Olympic Champ) Mickey Saad, Harry Hurst, Pell Mell and Frankie Young.

Ivan Doherty Booster Club promoter has this to say about the coming welterweight match "At the moment, the most talked-about fighter in this district is Duck Trainor. Local boxing fans remember Duck as a capable but cautious boxer.

That was over three years ago. Since then he has put on fifteen pounds and while in Paterson, Pette altered his style completely. Today Trainor doesn't take a backward step. He is the best combination boxer you'll see in the Maritimes. In his last fight on May the 24th, at Brantford, Ont., he outpointed Joey DeLong of Winnipeg in six rounds in one of the bloodiest fights ever seen in Brantford. De Long, the tough Indian who holds a decision over Claude Fortin (who fights Dick Howard on July 29 in Toronto) floored Trainor in the first round with a powerful left hook. He came up slugging and punched DeLong all over the ring.

So crowd pleasing was the fight that "Decon" Allen wanted to rematch them at the Maple Leaf Gardens in Toronto. But DeLong declined the offer. When local boxing fans get an eyeful of Trainor in action, they'll be pleasantly surprised and will see the greatest welterweight scrap ever held here. It should be a pier six brawl all right."

Promoter Doherty stated last night that the supporting card will be announced within a couple of days.

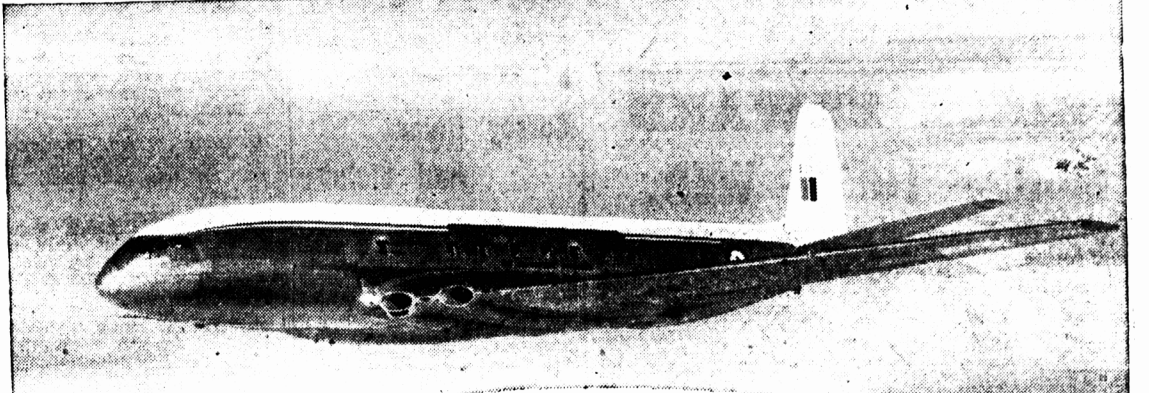

RCAF's New Jet Transport Sets Record

OTTAWA, May 29th: The new RCAF jet Comet yesterday averaged 420 miles an hour between London and Ottawa and set a new Atlantic transport speed record of 10 hours and 20 minutes flying time between the two capitals.

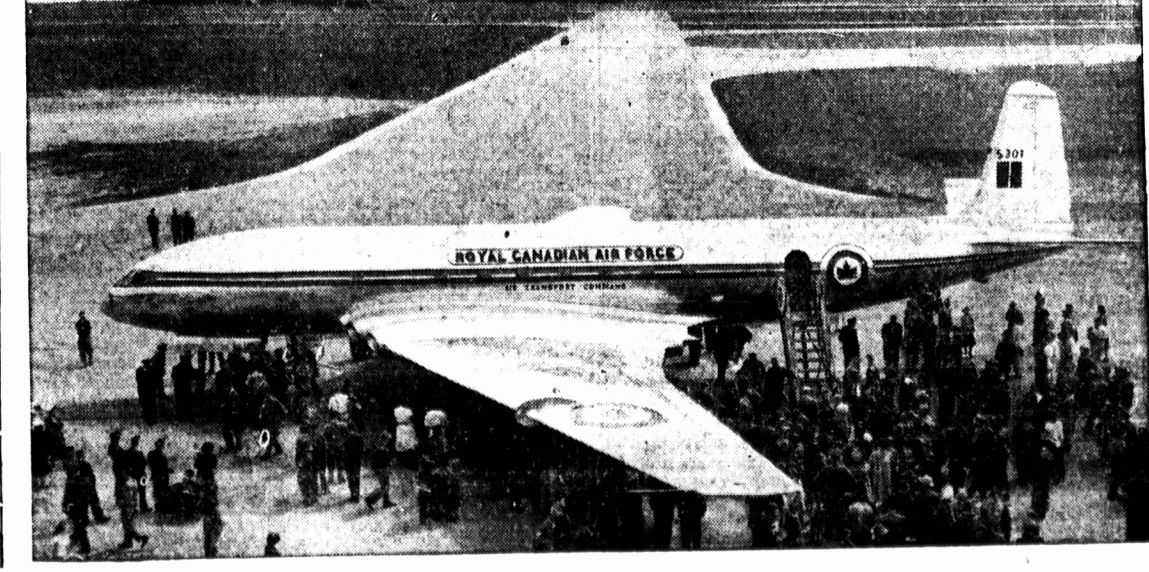
