### Royalty Earns A Name In The Realm Of Music

"Royal Musicians" is the heading for the following interesting article in the War Cry.

King Frederick IX of Denmark has been described as "the only monarch in the world who is also a working musician." A keen musician student since boyhood, the King's reputation as a conductor is well known and the Danish Royal Orchestra and the Danish States Radio Symphony Orchestra, as well as other groups including guards' bands and those attached to boys' brigades, have played under his direction. The King of Denmark is not the first royal personage to earn

a name for himself in the realm of music. Frederick the Great of Prussia was a fine flautist, for whom the great Bach composed. The ill-fated Marie Antoinette, in her youth at Schonbrunn Palace in Vienna, had Gluck for her singing master. Henry VIII of England, intended for the Church until the death of his elder brother made him heir to the throne, composed masses and motets. His daughter, the first Elizabeth, was a skilful player on virginals and the lute. Queen Victoria won the admiration of Mendelssohn for her high, clear voice, and her husband, the Prince Consort, was a capable composer and pianist.

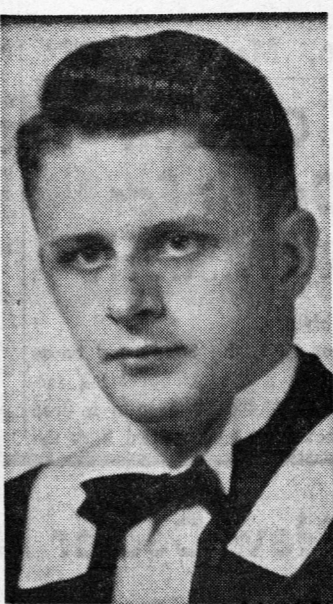
**HONOR FOR QUEEN**
