

Parkdale Flyers Blast Aces 13-5

The Parkdale Flyers clinched the title of the Island Senior B League in convincing fashion last night at the Sports Arena when they pounded out a 13-5 decision over the luckless Summerside Aces.

The Aces managed to score the first goal of the game but for the next two periods looked as if they were playing in the wrong league as the high-flying Flyers threw in 10 unanswered goals to go into the third period with a 10-1 lead and scored twice more in the early minutes of the third before the Aces could get untracked to make credible showing the rest of the way as they outscored the Flyers 4-1 in the last 13 minutes of the game.

The Aces apparently didn't learn any lessons when Allie Carver ran wild in their last appearance here and fired in 10 goals and once more Carver went on a rampage firing home 4 goals and helped out on 3 others for a big 7-point performance and practically assured himself of the league scoring title.

Allie's brother Skip equalled the coach's performance with a 7-point effort of his own on 3 goals and 4 assists. Parkdale's line of Kip Ready, Willie Dunn and Jim MacLeod never looked better since Bob Hurry was lost to the team through injury. Each of them hit for a pair of goals. MacLeod also picked up 4 assists, Dunn 3 and Ready 2. Edgely Taylor was the best man on the ice for the Aces as he fired a pair of third period goals as the Aces came out fighting to save themselves from complete humiliation. Cutcliffe, Saunders and Gaudet scored the others.

GAME LATE
The game was a little late in getting under way when Summerside was delayed on the highways and the Aces were forced to begin play with only 6 players. They gradually built up their strength to 10 men as their players began to arrive. However, they could dress only one regular defenseman, Ron MacArthur, for the game and as a result were no match whatever for Parkdale.

The game was only 2 minutes and 10 seconds old when Claude Gaudet batted a puck behind Roper from a pileup in front of the cage but when Allie Carver scored about a minute later the Flyers were on their way and before the period ended Carver had fired
