Six Children Die In Fire

KAUKAUNA, Wis. (AP)—Six panic-stricken children, five of whom crowded into the first-floor bathroom of their flaming home instead of escaping through a door only a few feet away, died early Sunday while their parents were at church.

The charred body of the sixth child was found at the foot of a stairway down which the children had fled from the upstairs rooms.

The victims were children of Mr. and Mrs. Floyd Weyneberg, who were attending mass at Holy Cross Roman Catholic Church four blocks away. The couple, whose infant twins died of natural causes earlier this year, have no other children.

Firemen, unable to enter the fiercely burning home for more than an hour after the first alarm sounded, recovered the bodies of Lynn, 7; Douglas, 6; Margaret, 5; John, 3; Barbara, 2½, and Michael, 1½.
