

# Flyers Blank Dodgers 3-0 In City Loop Baseball Tilt

Jimmy MacDonald's Flyers kept up their winning ways at Memorial Field last night as southpaw Jack Burke threw 3-hit ball for a 3-0 victory over the Dodgers in a city league baseball fixture.

Burke faced only 27 batters in the 7th inning. He walked two and one batter got a life on the only Flyer error of the game. It was Jack's second victory in as many starts.

Ronnie Stanley suffered the defeat although he gave up only 7 hits. Two walks and a single produced one run in the second inning and in the seventh the Flyers added another run on three singles, a fielder's choice and the lone Dodger error of the game.

Burke struck out 8 Dodgers and Stanley whiffed a like number of Flyers.

Both pitchers were given fine support by their teammates. The teams split two errors between them and in the top of the third inning the Dodgers pulled off the first double play of the year as Bobby Lund speared MacDonald's hot grounder, tossed to Whitlock and Irv MacKinnon stretched to take the relay for the twin kill.

Earl MacKinnon drove in the first Flyer run when he clipped a line shot into center field after Stanley had walked Jack Ready and Coker Pineau.

In the seventh Pineau got a life on a scratch single. He raced to second as Whitlock dropped Stanley's throw on MacKinnon's ground ball. Mark Ladner, a newcomer to

the city league, lofted a long single into right field and Pineau scored. Minutes later, Keith Dalzie' crossed up the opposition by bunting safely and scoring MacKinnon.

Seven different players garnered the Flyers hits, all of which were singles.

Dodgers third baseman Joey LeClair got the only extra-base blow of the game when he drove one down the left field line for a double. Bobby Lund and Irv MacKinnon got the other Dodger hits.

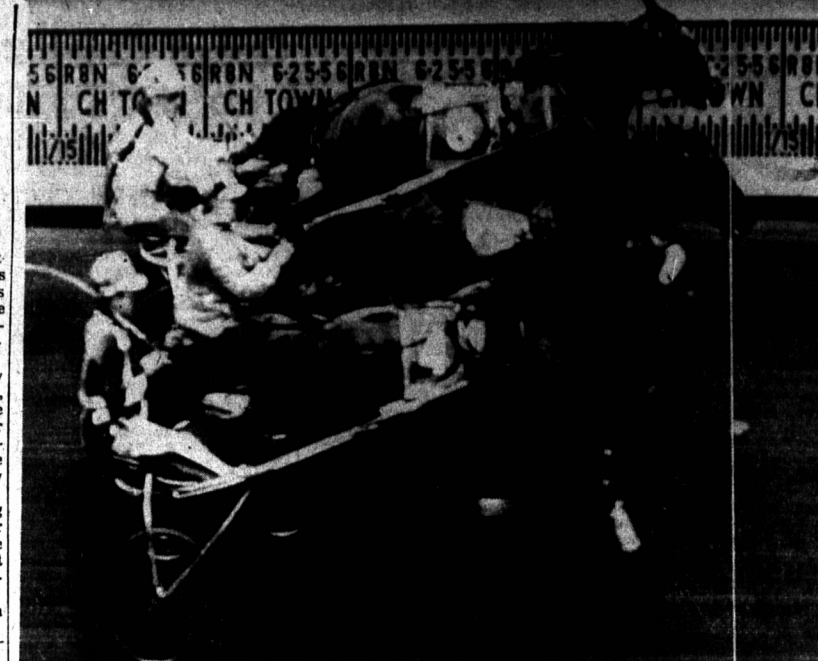
A meeting of the Summerside Baseball executive was held last night with the President, Layton Schurman, in the chair.
