Cold Water Shaves Face Militia Units

It will be life under canvas, early-morning parades, cold-water shaves and the camaraderie of army camp life during the next week for some 200 officers and men of Island militia units.

The P.E.I. part-time soldiers left here at eight o'clock this morning, bound for Camp Aldershot, N.S., a familiar location for thousands of World War Two veterans, where they will spend the next week undergoing an intensive period of training.

The Prince Edward Island Regiment (RCAF), under command of Lt. Col. E. G. MacLeod, MC, will have 106 men in camp; 5 Signal Regiment, commanded by Lt. Col. E. A. McCarey, will have approximately 70 all ranks in the group; and 5 Medical Company, commanded by Lt. Col. W. T. Hooper, will have 25 in camp.

This year, for the first time in almost a decade, the units will participate fully in corps training. This is a departure from recent years when militia units

Prince Edward Island Reg't Announces Two Promotions

The promotions of one officer and one senior non-commissioned officer of the Prince Edward Island Regiment have been announced. Captain G.A. Godfrey has been promoted to the rank of major, taking command of "B" Squadron of the Regiment, located at Montague. WO 11 P. A. LeClair moves up to the rank of WO 1, and has been appointed RSM of the Regiment.

Major Godfrey is a native of North Wiltshire. He joined the army in April, 1942, and served as a private and NCO at Charlottetown and Aldershot, N.S. He was commissioned at the first OTC at Trois Rivieres, Que., in February, 1945, and went overseas as a replacement officer in July, 1944.

He joined the North Nova Scotia Regiment and saw action in France, Belgium, and Holland. He was wounded in October, 1944, and later joined the P.E.I. Lighthorse at 2nd Corps HQ. He was promoted to the rank of captain in 1945 and returned to Canada early in 1946 as second-in-command of the P.E.I. LH.

He entered the Militia in 1953 as a lieutenant with the P.E.I. Regiment, was promoted to the rank of captain in 1962 and was second-in-command of the squadron at Montague at the time of his promotion to major.

Maj. Godfrey is married to the former Ellen Wood, Hazelbrook, and they have one son, Kevin, 9. He is employed with the postal department, Charlottetown.

RSM LeClair, a native of North Rustico, joined the P.E.I. Light Horse in 1940. He went on active service with the Cape Breton Highlanders in September, 1940, went overseas in 1942, and served with the unit in Italy and Northwest Europe, during the Italian and Normandy campaigns. He was discharged in March, 1946, holding the rank of sergeant.

WO 1 LeClair became associated with the militia in 1951 when he joined the P.E.I. Regiment as a sergeant. He represented the unit at the Coronation of Queen Elizabeth II in London in 1953, and he was promoted from sergeant to WO 11 in 1955.

He is married to the former Margaret Donette, North Rustico, and they have four children: Susan, 16; Lynn, 14; Bonnie, 9, and Cindy, 6.

Judge Describes Caribbean Trip

KENSINGTON — An account of his recent trip to Trinidad and Tobago was given by Judge W.E. Darby at the June meeting of the Kensington area Board of Trade held Wednesday evening.

This was the lady's night with a dinner meeting at Sverd's Inn. The judge's visit to the Caribbean Islands was brought about by problems regarding the operation of the police force in those countries.

As a result of many complaints of brutality and inefficiency of the police, the prime minister had a commission appointed with representatives from India, New Zealand, the United Kingdom and Canada. The speaker suggested that the Canadian representative may have been chosen from P.E.I. for the reason that the Islands of Trinidad and Tobago together are smaller than this province, although the population is greater, and a native of a small province might have better understanding.

Judge Darby was chosen to be chairman of the commission, a post in which he will continue to serve.

Assisting in yesterday ceremonies were: clergy from the Diocese of P.E.I. and the diocesan headquarters, Halifax, the University of Kings College, and Rev. Dr. Hatfield.

Following the service a reception was held in St. Paul's Parish Hall.
