## Souris South Is Given Two Months Jail Term

GEORGETOWN — Joseph Henry Daniel Philip Steele, Souris, was sentenced to two months in the Kings County Jail where he appeared before Magistrate James B. Johnston, QC, at Georgetown yesterday.

Steele had elected trial by magistrate and pleaded guilty at last week's sitting of the court to the charge of breaking and entering Percy's store in Souris. Steele was also sentenced to two months on a charge of escaping custody from the jail. On this charge he was sentenced last week to elected trial by a judge without a jury but at yesterday's sitting of the court he changed his election to trial by magistrate and pleaded guilty.

The two sentences will run concurrently. In passing sentence the magistrate took into consideration the age of the accused who is 19 and the fact that he has no previous record.

Deputy Attorney General J. Arthur McGuigan represented the Crown in all cases before the court.

ADJOURNED TO DEC. 8  
The case of Sidney Clair MacLellan, Montague, charged with impaired driving and represented by S. S. Hessian, QC, was adjourned to Dec. 5. Unable to attend yesterday's sitting, Mr. Hessian had J. P. Nicholson act as counsel for MacLellan.

Albert Joseph MacPhee, St. Georges, represented by Mr. Nicholson, and charged with impaired driving, had his case adjourned for hearing on Oct. 24.

In the case of Leonard Joseph Daly, St. Mary's Road, who is charged with impaired driving and in whose case the Crown witnesses were heard at an earlier sitting of the court, the accused yesterday gave evidence on his own behalf and the Crown witnesses were heard at a second sitting of the court, Oct. 17 to allow further defence evidence to be heard. Daly is represented by Mr. Nicholson.

John Thomas Creed, Stungou, changed an earlier plea of not guilty to one of guilty to an impaired driving charge and was fined \$30 and costs.

Raymond Duke Rattray, St. Peters, charged with possession of liquor in a place other than his residence, requested adjournment in his case to Oct. 10. The evidence of two Crown witnesses has already been heard in his case.

John Fletcher Harris, Murray Harbor, pleaded guilty to possession of stolen goods and was fined \$30 and costs. The articles in question in this case were recovered undamaged.

James Kenneth MacDonald, Montague represented by Mr. Nicholson, and charged with the possession of an amount of money not exceeding \$50 knowing that it was obtained by theft, had his case adjourned to Oct. 10 with no plea being taken. The accused was in court on a voluntary appearance.

Aart Vi Veld, Bear River, pleaded not guilty to causing bodily harm to Kyril Keen of Bear River by stabbing him with a ten and one-half inch fighting knife. The accused was represented by Mr. Nicholson. The accused was remanded on cash bail of \$1,000 and the case adjourned to Souris, Oct. 24.

Remains resting at the Montague Funeral Home with Interment from the Presbyterian Church, Cardigan, Friday at 2 p.m. Interment will be in Cardigan cemetery.

Charged with assault, both Luther Herring and Violet M./Mrs. Luther Percy Herring, both of Murray Harbor, both represented by Mr. Nicholson, had their case adjourned to Oct. 11. Pleas of not guilty were entered on behalf of both accused by their counsel at an earlier sitting of the court.

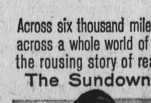
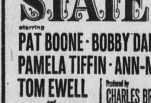
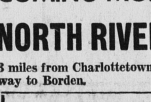

A fine of \$125 and costs was paid by E. Sterling Giddings, Charlottetown, on a charge of driving while impaired.

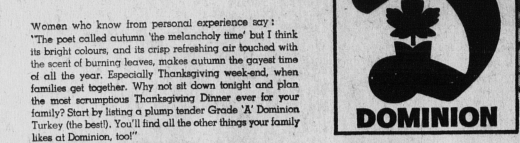
James Edward Devine, City, was fined \$30 and costs for speeding while Gerald Grimes, Charlottetown, was fined \$30 and costs on a similar charge.
