to-day one usually thinks of a famous garden and a great botanical centre, and for a great many years Kew has been renowned as such. However, a few centuries ago Kew was merely a small village on the Thames several miles from London.

In the 17th and 18th centuries, a part of the property which is now Kew Gardens belonged to Richmond Lodge and the other part to Kew House. Richmond Lodge was a favorite residence of George II and Queen Caroline.

Under Caroline's direction, and with the help of a famous landscape-gardener and architect, the Richmond Gardens became quite famous, it was in connection with the adjoining Kew House that the first real foundations of the Botanic Gardens as they are known to-day were laid.

In 1730, Frederick, Prince of Wales, leased the property and after his death in 1751 his widow, Princess Augusta of Saxe-Gotha, took it over and started the formation of the Botanic Gardens. Among those who assisted the Princess in establishing the Gardens were John Stewart, Earl of Bute, who acted as scientific director; Sir William Chambers, and architect; William Aiton, a famous horticulturist.

With the death of Princess Augusta in 1772, Kew House and the property came under the control of George III, and so the properties of Richmond Lodge and Kew House became one. At this time, also, Sir Joseph Banks became director of the Botanic Gardens, a position he held until his death in 1820. Under his guidance the Gardens acquired a fine collection of plants, and became famous.

When one hears the name Kew Sweet William has been transplanted from the field to permanent quarters in the borders and the fragrant pinks to the new rock garden. Scarlet geraniums have been placed on their stand on the veranda and so far have not been frozen. How Can I...

Q. How can I test the grade of gasoline?
