

WINNIPEG, April 30 — (CP) — Most coarse grain futures prices showed an irregular trend today on the Winnipeg Grain Exchange.

There was a fair commercial demand for oats at one stage of trading. Most of the demand was of a domestic character. Some processor buying of flax was noted.

The lower tone of the market was influenced by a decline in U.S. grain markets, by favorable crop reports, and by good progress in spring threshing in western Canada.

Prices for class two and L. W. A. wheat were one-eighth higher.

Rickey Denies "Touch" Reports

PITTSBURGH, April 30 — (AP) — Reports that Branch Rickey has asked the three Pittsburgh Pirates owners for \$300,000 to bolster the club's finances brought a strong denial from Rickey yesterday.

Published reports had the Pirates general manager planning to ask John Galbreath, Tom Johnson and Bing Crosby for \$100,000 each in anticipation of another losing financial year.

Rickey said: "This is the first I've heard of it. But if the club needed money—even a million dollars—that's something I wouldn't discuss with anyone."

One report said the reason for Rickey's need of money is his expensive build up of a farm system and the 1951 signing of several hundred players. It is said Rickey spent in excess of \$800,000 accomplishing this.

Retired Montreal Sportsman Dies

MONTREAL, April 30 — (CP) — H.A. (Louie) Letourneau, retired sportsman, died at his home here yesterday. He was 84.

Mr. Letourneau was formerly associated with Leo Dandurand and the late Joe Cattarinich in sport promotion. He retired 20 years ago when he sold to his partners his interests in the National Hockey League Canadiens, and in racing tracks at Dorval, Connaught Park, and several in the United States.

Born in St. Roche, Que., Mr. Letourneau about 1920 joined Dandurand and Cattarinich in race track promotions, and with them purchased the Canadiens from the Kendall estate for a reputed \$11,000.
