TORONTO, May 29.—The mayor is well pleased with the operation of the new legislation permitting divisional inspectors to release drunks arrested for the first or second time without sending them before the magistrate.

Last night 15 drunks were taken to the cells, sobbed up and let off without appearing in court. It is estimated that over 1500 drunks every year can be released under the by-law.

A By-Law for Altering and Specifying the Rate of Assessment on Real Estate and Personal Property in the City of Charlottetown for General Civic Purposes, under Statute 51 Victoria, Chapter 12.

BE it enacted by the City Council of the City of Charlottetown as follows:

1st. The rate of assessment on Real Estate for general civic purposes, under said Statute, A. D. 1892, and ending the 31st day of January, A. D. 1892, is hereby specified and fixed at the rate of ONE PER CENT, on every dollar of the value of Real Estate as assessed by the Assessor of the said City of Charlottetown in the General Assessment Book and Valuation Roll of all Real Estate and Personal Property liable to taxation in said City, and of all persons liable to pay Poll Tax therein, made and fully returned by them on the 5th day of May, A. D. 1892.

2nd. That the rate of assessment on Personal Property for such general civic purposes, for the year commencing the 1st day of January, A. D. 1892, and ending the 31st day of December, A. D. 1892, is hereby specified and fixed at the rate of ONE PER CENT, on the first dollar of the value of Personal Property as assessed by the Assessor of the said City in the said General Assessment Book and Valuation Roll, made and duly returned by them as aforesaid.

A By-Law for allowing a Rate of Discount on the Assessments on Real Estate and Personal Property in the City of Charlottetown for General Civic Purposes, for the current year ending the 31st day of December, A. D. 1892.
