## National Liberal Campaign Gets Underway On Island

Liberal Leader Lester B. Pearson will open his national election campaign here next Wednesday, it was learned Thursday from E. D. Reid, president of the P.E.I. Liberal Federation. He will be accompanied by J.W. Pickersgill and Senator John Connolly, president of the National Liberal Federation.

Mr. Pearson and party will arrive here at noon, speak to public meetings in Morell and Murray River that afternoon, and address a public meeting in the Queen Charlotte High School Auditorium that night. From here, he goes to Newfoundland, Mr. Reid added.

Progressive Conservative spokesman, Gerald R. Foster, said it would be a few days before his party's campaign would get into high gear, but the important work of organization is underway. Mr. Foster is president of the provincial federation.

Tan Webster, New Democratic party provincial president, said "interest is developing tremendously" in this province.

**NOT MUCH CAMPAIGNING**

Mr. Foster explained this morning that the PC candidates cannot do much about campaigning in their respective counties until their nominating conventions are held.

Everyone is agreed that the present members will be the choice of their constituencies, he observed, but it would be presumptuous of any one of them to start campaigning until he or she has been chosen officially by his constituency convention, it was explained.

The PC conventions are slated for next week, with Queens on April 26, Kings on April 27, and the Prince County convention on Saturday, April 28.

Hon. Angus MacLean and Heath MacQuarrie in Queens, Dr. Orville Phillips in Prince, and Margaret Macdonald in Kings are the people who represented their constituencies,

and their party, in the parliament that was closed yesterday.

It's interesting to note that none of them is entitled to the "MP" designation, now that parliament has been prorogued. They will have to earn that rank all over again at the June 18 election, or one or more of the other party candidates could earn it. That is for the people to decide at the polls.

It's a bit different for Mr. MacLean, though, as he retains the right to the "Honorable" designation for life, regardless of whether he is re-elected or defeated, or eventually retires from public life. As a member of the Privy Council of Canada, he retains that distinction and will do so as long as he lives.

New Democratic party candidates are Leo P. McIsaac and Wilfred Inman in Queens, Thomas Dunphy in Kings, and Arnold Wood in Prince.

## Island Will Get Four \$1,000 Scholarships

Four new scholarships of \$1,000 each will be awarded this year in Prince Edward Island by the National Advisory Council on Physical Fitness, P.E.I. council representative J. E. Ready said Thursday.

The scholarships will be for first-year students entering courses leading to a degree in physical education. The scholarships may be used at any Canadian university.

**COMPETITIVE BASIS**

They will be available for a one-year period only and will be subject to the requirement of first class honors, 75 percent, and will be awarded on a competitive basis.

Selection will be made by a special committee comprised of university representatives, the advisory committee, provinces, and the department of health.

Mr. Ready said he hoped students from across the province would get applications in for the competition. Full details will be distributed among the schools shortly, he said. The awards will be made in time for the fall term.

Also announced were plans for bursary assistance up to \$1,000 per student annually. It can be given to a scholarship recipient as a supplement to meet special need. The bursaries are to be paid from provincial allocations.

Mr. Ready also announced that six P.E.I. athletes will be chosen to attend the AAU trials in Ontario this summer. Money has already been voted for the expenses, he said.

Another major move to be initiated in the near future will be the establishment of a training centre for coaches in the Maritime Provinces. The location of the centre will be announced shortly, he said.

Next meeting of the advisory committee will be held in Toronto, beginning on Labor Day.

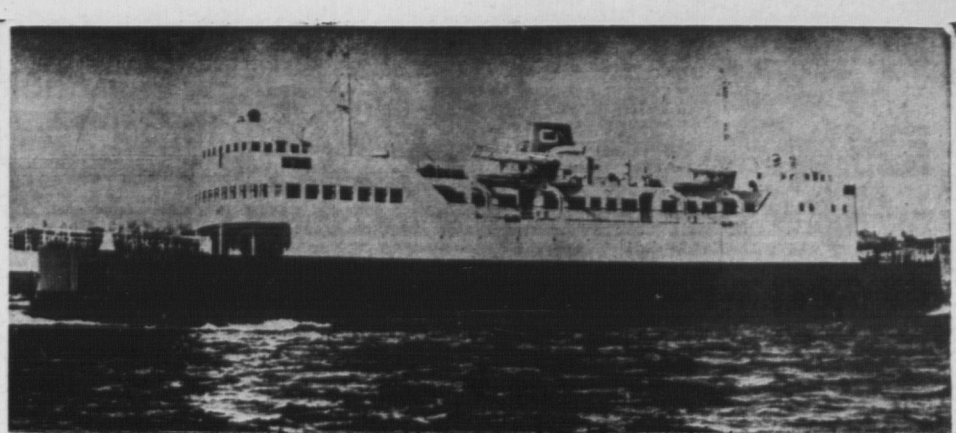
