# Earned Referees 'D' Your Job Be Fired?

STOCKHOLM (CP) — Play-off referee Bobby Kronm's acting bossing may turn out to be blessing in disguise for his Swedish team.

It has placed world hockey on the ice when they prevented any ugly incident on the ice when the 1963 championship tournament was held in this excited Swedish capital where Canadian hockey players were regarded as gods.

Kronm, who hopes to lead the Smoke Eaters to their third world title, bore the brunt of the punishment when he was hit by a block of ice thrown by a disgruntled fan during an exhibition game against Sweden's defending champions at Goteborg last Friday night.

Kronm suffered a nasty slash to the head that required six stitches to mend. The game itself got completely off and ran as the Canadians won 5-2.

ISSUES ULTIMATUM (Bunney) Ahearn of London, European president of the International Ice Hockey Federation, laid down an ultimatum to the referees—do your job or be fired.

"The referees are not the council of the IIHF, which includes the leading officials of the game, but they are acting as a disciplinary committee," he said. "Any serious penalties or fighting will have to be reported in writing by the referees. Then we shall decide what punishments to hand out. If referees don't do their job efficiently then they will get the sack."

It is the 13th world championship, now attending his 23rd championship, figures the battle for the title rests among Czechoslovakia, Finland, West Germany, East Germany and the United States will play in Group A. Only these countries are qualified for the title.

The 13 other countries entered for the two lower group B comprises England, Switzerland, Poland, Romania, France, Norway and Yugoslavia; Group C Denmark, Austria, Belgium, Hungary, the Netherlands and Bulgaria.
