Scottish Agriculture

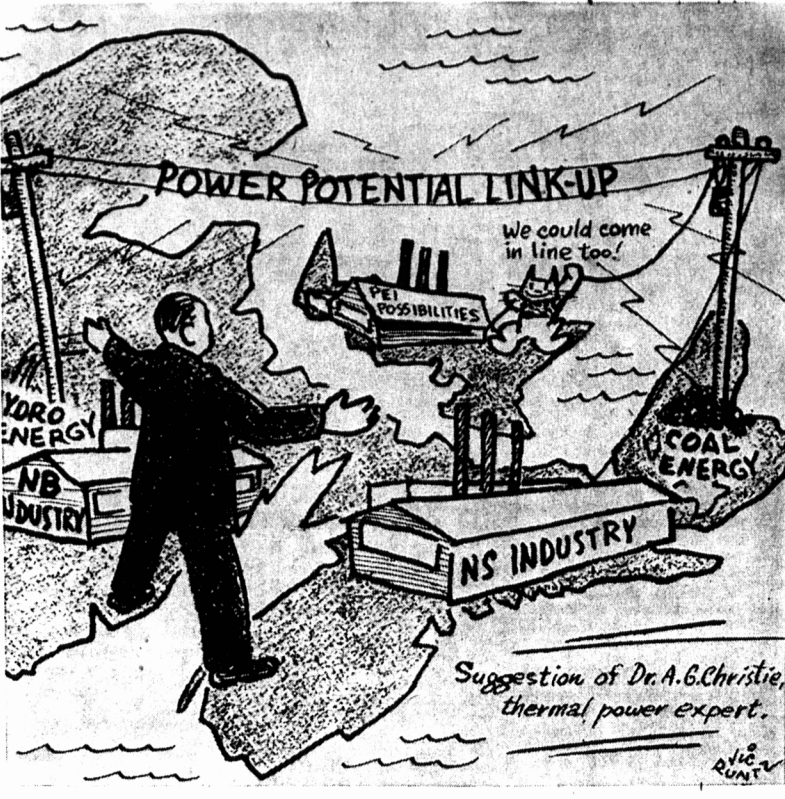
Now that the first atomic war vessel—the submarine Nautilus—has been put into service, President Eisenhower is asking Congress for money to build a merchant ship to be run by nuclear energy.

A solar cooking stove, composed simply of a concave mirror and a support for pots and pans, is to be marketed commercially by an Egyptian firm, which expects to manufacture about 18,000 stoves a year.

In a return tabled last week in the House of Commons it was shown that the total cost, to date, to the Federal Government of the Trans-Canada Highway has been \$63,401,393.

Dance-Language Of Bees

Professor Karl von Frisch, of the University of Munich is known to his colleagues as "Bee Frisch." This outstanding biologist, who did much of his research work at Vienna and Graz, owes his worldwide fame to his unique investigation of the language of the bees.

A bee having found a feeding-place will hurry to the hive to tell its fellow-bees of the treasure. Let us first consider the rarer case of dancing on the horizontal landing-board.

The simplest piece of information a bee describes is a small circle, but just before it is completed it turns back sharply and runs a parallel circle in the opposite direction. It repeats this many times.
