Shakespeare without tears

The title of an early study of Shakespeare's plays, "Shakespeare Without Tears", aptly applies to the current series of Shakespeare films co-sponsored by the UPEI Departments of English and Extension. "The Taming of the Shrew" and "Romeo and Juliet", both directed by Franco Zeffirelli, have been shown to capacity houses. Both movies demonstrate the very fresh and effective way in which Elizabethan drama can be transferred to the 20th century movie screen. Both films also demonstrate the way in which Shakespeare thematic concerns were not related only to English Renaissance, society but are "for all times". Obviously love stories, family feuds, greed, pride, jealousy, youthful impetuosity, and

all the other human traits that Shakespeare writes of are all timeless.

The remaining films in the series will continue to demonstrate that Shakespeare's plays can be enjoyable to watch and can be relevant to the lives of modern people. All these 16 mm films will be shown in the Confederation Centre Main Theatre at 7:30 p.m. on Sundays:

- Julius Caesar (1953, B/W) Nov. 7
- Henry V (1944, colour) Nov. 28
- Hamlet (1969, colour) Jan. 30 '77
- Othello (1965, colour) Feb. 20
- King Lear (1970, B/W) March 13
- Macbeth (1963, colour) March 27
- Extra Film (to compensate for mechanical problems with film #1) April 3
