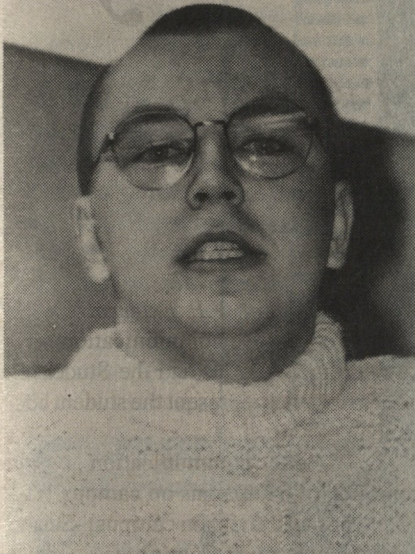

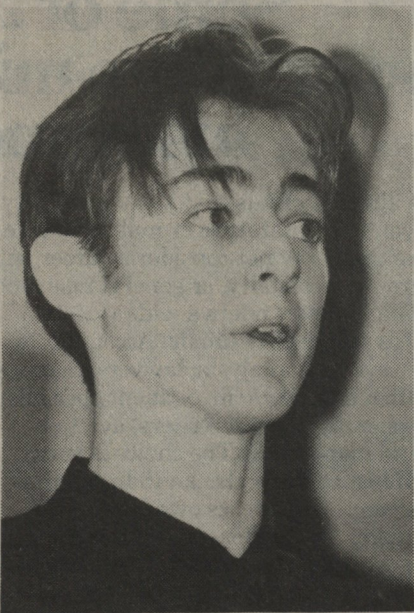
involved in the intermural organization.”
