Following are excerpts from the farm market report prepared by Mr. W. R. Shaw, Deputy Minister of Agriculture.

Livestock At Montreal this week cattle are slow and steady. Cows are fifty to one dollar easier. Bulls are steady. Good steers are quoted at 33.00; good cows 24.00 to 25.00; good bulls 26.00 to 27.50. Calves are steady with good at 37.00 to 38.00. Lambs are 26.00 to 29.50; hogs 27.00; Grade A sows 22.00 to 23.00.

At Moncton this week cattle prices have been revised slightly downward. The following is the detail: Hogs at Moncton: Grade A 27.00; Grade B 26.60; No. 1 sows 22.50; No. 2 sows 21.50; hot dressed weight delivered.

Cattle at Moncton: Delivered to plant. Steers: Up to 1,000 lbs. Choice 28.50 to 29.50; Good 27.00 to 28.00; Medium 25.00 to 26.00; Common 23.00 to 24.00. Over 1,000 lbs. Choice 29.00 to 30.00; Good 27.50 to 28.50; Medium 25.50 to 26.50; Common 23.50 to 24.50.

The following are quotations at the present moment: No. 1 feed oats is \$2.99 per cwt. in bulk; Barley No. 1 is \$3.21 to \$3.23; while No. 6 Wheat stands at \$3.10. Any barley orders will not be delivered before five weeks. Bran is approximately \$70.00 per ton, and also shorts; while oilmeal and soybean meal, and concentrates, are almost impossible to secure.

On the Charlottetown market the price has also advanced this past week and is now being quoted at 69 1-2c for prints delivered with local jobbing at 71c.
