Yanks Reject ECM Offer In Chicken War

BRUSSELS (Reuters)—The United States Tuesday night rejected a Common Market offer of a 10 per cent reduction of the community's import charges on U.S. frozen chickens.

The rejection was contained in a statement issued by the United States mission to the Common Market.

The reduction, amounting to about 13 U.S. cents a pound, was conditional on the U.S. renouncing all negotiations for a 10 per cent cut with no hope of further action.

The "chicken war" has caused relations between the U.S. and the Common Market countries for some time. The American, demanding the Common Market tariff protection on American chickens is discriminatory.
