

Gov't Agrees Death Benefits Scheme Optional

OTTAWA (CP) — The government has agreed to make optional an insurance scheme that would provide a maximum of \$5,000 death benefits for civil servants and members of the armed forces. K. W. Taylor, deputy finance minister, told a Senate committee Wednesday of the government's decision which follows considerable criticism in Parliament and by civil service associations of compulsory and other features of the plan. Representatives of three civil service organizations told the committee that the decision to make the scheme optional meets their objections in part but more time should be given to study the plan affecting about 120,000 civil servants and about 105,000 servicemen. Mr. Taylor said that the government would be willing to make the scheme optional provided no more than 25 per cent of those affected remain outside the plan. It would be dropped if more stay out. A 90-day period would be given for civil servants and servicemen to make their decisions. The scheme would not come into effect until after Jan. 1, 1955.

Eaton Company Acquires Fitzroy Street Properties

Three properties on Fitzroy Street have been acquired by The Eaton Company at the rear of their new building under construction.

They are the properties of Mrs. Augustus Large, 128 Fitzroy; Mr. John MacKay, 130 Fitzroy and Mrs. Georgina Doyle, 136 Fitzroy. The buildings on these sites will eventually be demolished to make room for a parking area which Eatons will have at the rear of the store.

In the meantime construction on the new Eaton building is well up to schedule. All of the 450 tons of structural steel has been placed and a small portion of this remains to be welded into position. About thirty men, including carpenters, steel workers and plumbers, are at present engaged on the job. It is not expected that the peak employment will exceed fifty men.

It will be the nicest store that Eatons will have said Mr. W. L. Coffey, general superintendent of the job for Anglin Norcross, Maritime Ltd. "They may have bigger ones but they will have none nicer."

A feature of the new store will be one single window running the entire length of the front with no upright support. This is made possible by the cantilever construction at the front of the building. The entrance will be only six inches above the level of the sidewalk.

The basement will have a terrazzo floor as will the forward portion of the main floor. The rear of the main floor, which is at a slightly higher level, will be covered with linoleum. The mezzanine floor is to have a covering of deep carpet.

LONDON (Reuters) — Foreign Secretary Eden called Wednesday for a Southeast Asian non-aggression pact and warned against military moves likely to upset India-China peace talks at Geneva.

He made his statements in opening a House of Commons foreign policy debate barely 24 hours before he and Prime Minister Churchill fly to Washington for talks with President Eisenhower.

Eden said he still saw "a chance—and I do not put it higher than that"—that the drawn-out Geneva negotiations will finally find a solution for Southeast Asian peace.

He said he is ready to return to the conference "if by doing this
