General Telegraphic News.

LONDON June 2.—A despatch from Tehran states that cholera is epidemic at Meshed, 115 deaths having occurred in a single day. People are fleeing from their homes.

ST. PETERSBURG, June 2.—A report issued by the Minister of Husbandry, states that seed corn and winter crops are in a satisfactory condition, owing to the plentiful rainfall during May. Summer sown crops elsewhere promise well.

PITTSBURG, Pa., June 2.—The United Presbyterian general assembly last night adopted resolutions characterizing the exclusion of Chinese from America as unchristian, unpatriotic and a monstrous injustice. President Harrison's signature to such a bill was pronounced to be evidence that he was not a Christian.

MONTEAL, June 2.—There is much interest here over news from the Honclou rebellion. Col. Ashford, one of those arrested for treason, is a brother of C. W. Ashford, ex Attorney-General of Kingston, and both were born in Port Hope, Ontario. A telegram received from Honolulu says the charge will not be proven against Ashford.

WICHITA, Kan., June 2.—A passenger train on the Santa Fe road was held up by masked robbers near Red Rock station in the Cherokee strip, last night. The train was flagged. The engineer and fireman were taken prisoners. The robbers then entered the express car, broke open the safe and secured its contents said to be \$50,000. The passengers were not molested.

ST. PETERSBURG, June 2.—A disastrous conflagration occurred at Slovodka, a suburb of Nevno, the capital of the government of Laveno, which borders on Germany. Three hundred houses were burned, most of the inhabitants of the burned houses being workmen, and they lost everything they possessed. They are absolutely destitute and their situation is deplorable.

GALVESTON, June 2.—A despatch from Lott, Texas, says a terrific cyclone visited that section last evening. Twelve houses were demolished, three persons were killed outright, and twelve seriously injured. Utter desolation is left in the path of the cyclone. Large houses were carried a distance of 200 yards.

ST. LOUIS, June 2.—The aggregate losses caused by the great flood, based upon reliable estimates, reach twenty-nine million dollars. This estimate does not include stagnation in business among merchants and transportation lines. A conservative estimate of the amount of damage from high waters from Kansas City to New Orleans places the figures at fifty million dollars.

The wrapper is a single film of leaf wrapped around the plug and is never good smoking tobacco. It is costly only because of its fine color.
