- 3. Co-ordination of services of adjacent municipalities
- 4. Providing information to municipalities and other agencies operating within the Province.
- 5. Training within the Province.
- 6. Assistance to municipalities on plans to meet civil disaster.
- 7. Protection against sabotage of provincial services and advice and assistance in protecting municipal and privately owned services.
- 8. Insofar as within Provincial authority, providing legal authority for local action.

**Municipal or Local**

In each municipality considered by the provincial authority to require a civil defence organization, or itself desiring one, the municipal authority will be responsible for taking effective action to set up the organization for civil defence.

Its object will be to make use of all the available resources to minimize the effects of an attack. To this end, an organization should be based on the normal civic operations, augmented by volunteers and voluntary organizations, and supported, where necessary, by provincial and federal agencies.

This may include:

civil defence authority (board, committee) consisting of: A director appointed by the municipality. If the director is not full time and the size and circumstances of the municipality require it, a full time director of civil defence should be appointed; Chief of Police; Fire Chief; municipal engineer; representatives of the electric power services; hospital and medical services; transportation and communications services; food supply; press and radio.

2. The municipal authority will be responsible for evaluating consequences of attack or disaster and preparing public warning systems, arrangements for the care and evacuation of the injured, evacuation of others, restoration of municipal services, etc.

3. The municipal authority should be in a position to advise those intending to construct buildings as to the desirability of dispersion, reinforcement, special construction, etc.

4. Under the municipal authority, the Chief of Police should normally be responsible for the organization of air-raid protection services on a community, district or block basis, as required. To facilitate this there should be established a skeleton volunteer organization to set up the appropriate system of aid to the police in the way of A.R.P. wardens, special constables, first aid and rescue squads, etc.

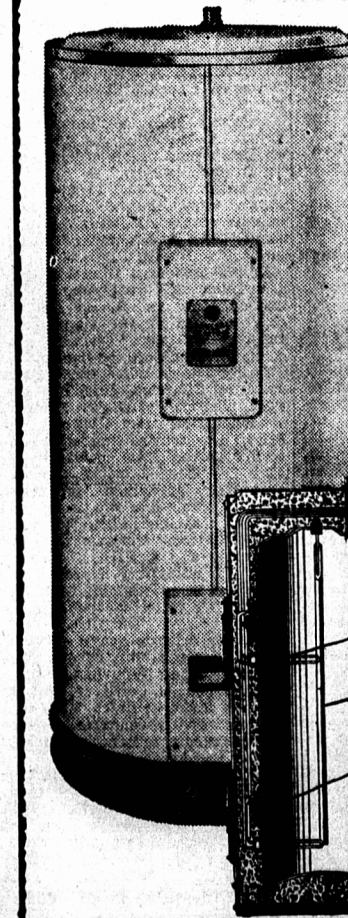
