REAR-ADMIRAL LAY

Retires After 40 Years Of Naval Service

OTTAWA (CP)—Rear-Admiral Horatio Lay, 54, of Walkerton, Ont., and Ottawa, who commanded the first aircraft carrier operated by the Royal Canadian Navy, retires in January after 40 years of navy service.

Vice-chief of naval staff at headquarters here since August, 1954, he goes on retirement leave Jan. 24, the navy announced today. He will be succeeded by Commodore Ernest Patrick Tisdall, 50, of Victoria and Ottawa who will be promoted to the rank of rear-admiral.

Rear-Admiral Lay served as commander of the destroyer Restigouche in the early days of the Second World War. When the navy decided in 1943 to broaden its activities to include naval aviation, he was named commander of the Royal Navy carrier Nabob, the first flat-top operated by the Canadian Navy.

A native of Skagway, Alaska, Rear-Admiral Lay entered the Royal Naval College of Canada at Esquimalt, B.C., in 1918 at the age of 15. He graduated as a midshipman in 1921 and served for the next four years in Royal Navy ships.

After the Second World War he served as director of plans at naval headquarters, then as director of plans and intelligence. He was named assistant chief of naval staff (warfare) and a member of the naval board in 1952. He was promoted to the rank of rear-admiral in October, 1954, two months after becoming vice-chief of the staff.

P.E.I. Man's Work Is Commended

Although he has been working in Ontario for only four months, L.W. Roper, formerly of Southport, Prince Edward Island, was warmly praised by the president of the Ontario Ayrshire Breeders Association at a recent meeting.

The President W. Clarence Mann Peterboro, R.R. 4 said in part: "This year we feel we have taken a step forward in appointing a fieldman for the province. In William Cable's message last September he mentioned that our breeders felt the need of a fieldman. And so at the annual meeting in Cornwall, last February the directors gave the executive the task of selecting a man for the job and also of finding the money for his salary and expenses."

"Through the recommendation of one of our members we selected L.W. Roper of Southport, P.E.I. His experience as a livestock fieldman in that province with the Federal Department of Agriculture along with his quiet, genial manner makes me confident in saying that we are very fortunate to have such a man to work along with our breeders."

"Ontario is a large province but Mr. Roper has covered the greater part of it and has visited many of the breeders in the four months he has been with us. I know he will do his best to help you. I do not believe he ever forgets anyone he has visited or met in connection with his work."

Mr. Roper's activity in the Ontario Ayrshire field is reflected in the amount of space allotted to him in the Canadian Ayrshire Review official organ of the Ayrshire Breeders Association of Canada. Each month since he has come to Ontario, he has had at least one story of his published. The current issue carries three or four stories by him.

Wage Fight Against Drought

PEIPING, (Reuters)—Tens of millions of peasants living in the north China plain are waging a day and night struggle against drought which threatens the winter wheat crops in the provinces of Honan, Hopei and Shantung.

The Peiping People's Daily reported Tuesday more than 10,000,000 peasants in Honan alone are working to irrigate lands badly affected so that sowing may continue.
