

Current Notes.

Dr. William Tarr, of London, is dead. Lord Talbot DeMalahede, died at London on the 17th. The Queen will open the Fisheries Exhibition in London. The coronation of the Czar will likely be postponed until June 20th. Sir Philip Rose, formerly an intimate friend of Lord Beaconsfield, is dead. Six business firms in Paternoster Square, London, including several publishers, were burned out on the 17th. Mr. Richard Power, member of Parliament for the city of Waterford, has resigned the position of whip of the Irish party. The resignation is due to ill health. The race for the Great Northern Handicap was won by Johnstone's colt "Border Minstrel," with Sanderson's filly, "Mermaid," second. There were eight starters. Mr. Harrington, member of Parliament for West Meath, who has just completed his term of imprisonment has been released. He is in good health. He takes his seat in the Commons on Thursday. Norman has identified Doctor Gallagher as Fletcher, the person who, according to Norman's claims, engaged him to carry the dynamite box that was taken from him in London. It is generally believed that both Bernard, Gallagher and Norman have turned informers. The London Times, says the Canadian Pacific Railway officials yesterday notified the authorities of the Grand Trunk Railway Co., that they would not be able to carry out the contemplated arrangements between the two companies, because of objections raised to it in America. The House of Commons on the 17th, as an additional mark of recognition of services rendered during the recent war against Arabi Pash in Egypt, of Lord Wolsey and Baron Alcester (Admiral Seymour), passed a vote granting them each £2,000 yearly, which at their death is to revert to their next heirs. The trial of twenty-six members of the South Russian Workmen's Federation was concluded at Odessa, on the 16th, and resulted in the conviction of all the prisoners. Three were sentenced to penal servitude for life; seven to fifteen years penal servitude; four to ten years; four to four years, and eight were banished to Siberia.
