### THE MARKETS.

**Cheese and Butter.**

The Montreal Gazette reports: "At the wharf, 7,000 Quebec cheese were offered, and all were sold at the range of 91-8 to 91c, which is a clean jump of 3c per pound on last Monday's basis. For Ontario cheese and finest Townships, 91c is the very inside figure today, and ideas run as high as 91c, while holders are not urging sales at all. The Liverpool cable was 43s 6d today.

As to butter the activity and strength of the market is retained, and buyers are freely bidding 18 1/2 to 18 3/4 for finest creamery with sellers independent at the range. Undergrades are quoted down to 17c, as to condition. Dairy butter ranges from 14 1/2 to 14 3/4, as to grade.

### Canadian Fleece Wool.

There is still a large quantity of last season's wool clip on the Canadian market, there being probably 400,000 pounds in Toronto alone, some of which was bought at less than 16 cents, says the Canadian Journal of Fabric. New fleece wool is coming in freely, and though dealers entered the market first at 14 cents a pound, they are not anxious to buy, and it is not unlikely that growers and country merchants will carry part of the clip well into the season. In the country districts local causes have slightly advanced prices, and general store keepers and some manufacturers have paid 16 cents a pound in some cases. The present price on Canadian fleece is the lowest on record, and is 2 cents per pound lower than the price of wool at the same season in any of the past eleven years.

Prices in the United States market are advancing, but there is no demand as yet for Canadian fleece, and it would appear that if Canadian wool is to find a market abroad it must do so to a certain extent as Canadian cloth. Some of our mills already recognize this, and are adapting themselves to the combining of Canadian wools for their very extensive, if not exclusive use in many lines of worsteds, to which they are well adapted.

### Live Hogs.

There were 300 fat hogs offered at the Canadian Pacific Stock Yards, Montreal, on Monday last, which sold readily at \$4.25 to \$4.50 per 100 lbs. weighed off cars, in straight lots.

### Notes From Saint Peter's.

Our cheese factory is receiving a large supply of milk, which is manufactured into first class cheese by our popular cheesemaker, Mr. Albert Donnelly, better known to his friends as "Abb." Some say he should have a day's outing, but he says he is waiting for the grand picnic to be held here in a short time. It will be the coming event of the season and all lovers of a good time should attend.

Miss Annie McCallum and Miss Maud Lewis are home from Boston visiting their parents and friends. Both intend returning to the Hub where they have succeeded in doing well.

Crops here look finely.

The Head St. Peter's Bay Starch Company has entered into a contract with the farmers for 100 acres of potatoes for which they promise to pay 24 cents per 100 lbs. delivered at the factory, the potatoes to be as they grow, large and small, but clear of clay and rot.
