

August Continued Cool, Wet Meteorologist Records Show

This province has experienced August another cool wet month, similar to its predecessor.

Warren Burns, meteorologist at the Experimental Farm in Charlottetown, commented this weekend on the contrast between the two successive months of record-breaking hot, dry weather in 1961 with this summer's two months of rain and chill.

Figures released by Mr. Burns show that this has been the wettest August in 11 years, with 5.94 inches of rain falling in 13 days—just 1.17 inches short of the 7.11 inches accumulated in 1951. This, however, is higher than last month's average temperature of 64 degrees, just 1.4 degrees short of a 35-year average. Highest temperature, recorded August 28, was 82 degrees, and the lowest was 42 degrees August 21. This is just one degree above the record of 41 degrees, established August 17, 1923.

The hottest August on record, with an average of 70.3 degrees, was experienced in 1937, and the coldest, in 1912, had a monthly average of 61.7 degrees.

Although total hours of sunshine have not yet been compiled by Mr. Burns, he estimates that the number of hours is considerably below average for August.
