### Astor May Win British Derby Observers Say

FROM DOWN, England, May 14.—(C.P.)—Interest in the 157th running of the Derby May 27 centres around the entries of Lord Astor, who never before has won the greatest of turf classics, although three times, in 1922, 1923 and 1924 his colors ran second.

ombo in 1934, the classic's situation this year is peculiarly obscure, but through the confusion of turf critics are pointing to two fine Manton-trained colts from Lord Astor's stables. The current favorite for the Epsom classic, Lord Astor's Pay Up, forged to the front in the betting following his impressive victory in the first of the great classics, the Two Thousand Guineas at Newmarket. Earlier in the season he had made short work of numerous opponents in the Free Handicap over seven furlongs. He is a brown colt by the St. Leger winner Fairway out of Book Debt.

Rhodes Scholar, is something of a "dark horse" and appeals to those who stay by the old racing maxim, "Fourth in the Guineas, first in the Derby". But this fine colt, by Pharos out of Book Law, a winner of the St. Leger, has more than superstition behind him. At Newmarket he aroused tremendous interest in the paddock. In matter of looks he is all that his admirers claim. He is a rich bay, strong in frame with very powerful forelegs and gaskins. He has perfectly-sprung ribs and strong quarters. Rhodes Scholar ran only once as a two-year-old, when he was certainly not at his best. At the Epsom spring meeting

he ran a close second to the Aga Khan's Taj Akbar in a fine race, and in the Guineas he finished fourth. The Derby has been a most unlucky race for the Manton stable. Not since Lemberg won in 1910 has the prize been secured for the famous Wiltshire stable, and many race-goers are convinced this is the year a Manton horse will click. The stable has seven colts left in the race, including Reburn and a third Astor entry, Double Remove, who ran one, two in the Column Produce Stakes, Reburn, by Edario out of Harry, will be ridden in the classic by J. Marshall, who has already ridden a winner of the Derby.

in Trigo. Double Remove is by Felstead out of Quick Rise. Followers of the Aga Khan's stables are now looking to his colt Mahmood, who ran second to Pay Up by a short head in the Guineas. This grey, almost white son of Elmshelm, winner of the Derby in 1930, ran an impressive race, although he is generally conceded not to be in the class of his stablemate, Bahram, winner last year of the mythical "triple crown"—the Guineas, the Derby and the St. Leger. Prior to the Guineas, however, his reputation as a stayer was poor, and the Derby is half a mile longer than the Guineas course at Newmarket. One of the best-looking and best-

bred of the Derby candidates is the bay colt Bala Hissar, also from the stables of the Indian Prince. An early favorite, he has excelled in the betting since his sluggish performance in the Guineas. Other prominent contenders include the Duke of Marlborough's Monument, Lord Derby's St. Magnus, and Sir George Bullough's Daytona. Daytona ran ninth in the Guineas, for which he was the favorite, while both Monument and St. Magnus are by Sansovino whose stock as a rule cannot act on firm ground. Each, however, is a very good looking and well-grown colt with great possibilities.

INDIAN TEAM HAS ELEPHANT MASCOT (By The Canadian Press) LONDON, May 13.—"Win or lose, we will only be satisfied if we play the game," said the Maharajah Kumar of Visianagram, captain of the Indian cricket team on his arrival in England. The Indian skipper is 31 years old and his elder brother is the reigning maharajah. An aggressive batsman, he received part of his education in Hallebury. A grey stuffed elephant, gift of the India Board of Cricket Control, was among his possessions. The mascot
