

Richer Returns Are Expected From Federal Tax Reductions

OTTAWA (CP)—Mr. and Mrs. Canadian taxpayer may have to gaze into the crystal ball to catch a glimpse of the full benefits which may result from Tuesday night's budget.

The immediate effect on their pocketbooks—if they are income taxpayers with dependent children in their 1962 income tax. Richer returns may lie in the years ahead.

Gov't Expects To Activate Corporations

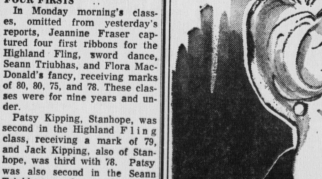
The government's Executive Council is expected Thursday to activate several corporations set up at the last session of the Legislature by appointing boards of directors.

The Legislature approved the formation of a Crown building corporation under which the proposed provincial building to be constructed; a senior citizens housing corporation; etc.

Also probable to come before the council is the matter of a government committee's recommendation that the provincial building be built on the block now occupied by West Kent School.

Approval of the site by the council is being held until construction can begin.
