In picking names for race horses one has to use a lot of ingenuity as so many thousands are registered and no two can bear the same name and they cannot be named after any living person without that person's written permission.

A 5-year-old pacing gelding bought at Delaware sale late last fall has been showing real speed at Sydney Raceway. He is Tritonia's Bob 2:04. He wasn't a "pig in a poke" as when being offered at the sale he was still performing at Englewood, Calif. On October 15 he won a \$1,500 pace in 2:06 and again in November 6 he won a \$1,000 pace in 2:05 and ended up the year by winning a \$750 pace on November 23 in 2:04.45. His owner then was Jack K. Fries, Durand, Mich. Last Saturday night he won both dashes in the Free For All at Sydney for owner-driver Archie Shore of Glace Bay, heading Bonnyville, True Linn and Grey Eagle, Time, 2:10.35—the fastest time stepped over Sydney track this season—2:12.45. Bonnyville was 2:06, True Linn 5:2.

The free for all pacer Josedale Double Hal 2:05 1-5 has been sold by A.D. Napke, Newcastle, N.B. to Millett Coughlan of Saint John. The Double Hal horse was a good performer in Johnny Conroy's stable and should make things interesting in his class at Saint John Raceway.

LONDON (CP)—Desmond Hackett, sports columnist of the Daily Express, says in a dispatch from Toronto that the British Boxing Board of Control should not allow British boxers to become the "victims" of American fighter Archie Moore. Hackett says Moore has suggested the possibility of a fight in Toronto next year against a British fighter, possibly Joe Ersking. He quotes Moore as saying "I wish to keep busy and I know there are some good fighters over in England." Hackett, who describes Moore's ninth-round victory Wednesday night over Canadian James J. Parker as "a piece of butchery," says: "I warn the British Boxing Board of Control that they must not allow these British fighters to be exposed to the kind of treatment Parker endured just because these Americans want to keep their new gold strike paying off rich dividends without their getting hurt."
