Chili Sauce

- 4 qts. (24 to 28 medium-sized) peeled and chopped tomatoes
- 2 cups chopped, sweet red pepper
- 2 cups chopped onion
- 1 hot pepper, chopped
- 2 tablespoons celery seed
- 1 tablespoon mustard seed
- 1 bay leaf
- 1 teaspoon whole cloves
- 1 teaspoon ground ginger
- 1 teaspoon ground nutmeg
- 2 three-inch pieces stick cinnamon
- 1 cup firmly packed brown sugar
- 1 1/2 cups vinegar
- 2 tablespoons salt

Combine the tomatoes, sweet peppers, onion, and hot pepper. Put the celery seed, mustard seed, and cinnamon loosely in a thin white cloth; tie top tightly; add to tomato mixture and boil until you have but one half the original amount. Stir frequently to prevent sticking.

Add sugar, vinegar, and salt. Boil rapidly, stirring constantly, about five minutes. Remove spices. Pack chili sauce into hot, clean jars; fill to top and seal. Makes about five pints.
