

Odds and Ends.

On the completion of his 18th year as Bishop of Buffalo, Rt. Rev. Dr. Ryan received from the priests of his diocese a cheque for \$20,000 to help pay the bills for his new house on Delaware avenue.

The total number of immigrants arrived at the ports of the United States from the principal foreign countries, except from the Dominion of Canada and Mexico, during ten months ended October 31, 1887, was 454,000, against 333,824 in 1887.

A large number of ladies have petitioned the Prussian Minister of Education against appointing male instead of female teachers for the upper girls' school. The petitioners take the ground that male teachers do not understand the inner life of girls, who are thus educated in a purely external, inconsistent and superficial manner.

The number of sea-going vessels which have arrived at Montreal this season is 356, against 364 for last year, a decrease of eight vessels. But though the number is less than last year, the tonnage is greater. In 1886 the amount of the sea-going tonnage at that port was 592,306 tons; this year the total amount is 901,962, showing an increase for this year of 9557.

Wedding favors are now in fashion, says the New York Mail and Express. They are entirely new this season, but have become popular. The favors preferred are either in the shape of a flower or of a bell. They are made of colored paper. The bell is about four inches in length and is hung from a brass or steel wire stand. Within the bell is fastened a small box containing a piece of wedding cake. The bells are often very handsomely hand-painted. The flowers are of various designs, and in the centre, carefully hidden under the leaves, is placed the box which contains the piece of wedding cake.

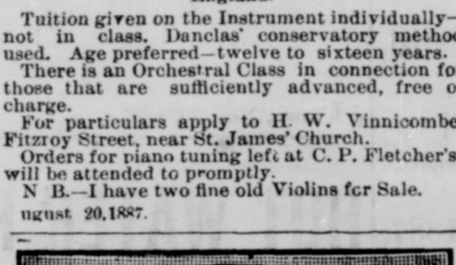
