PLACES HIS WIFE IN AN ASYLUM AND MARRIES AGAIN.

A St. Louis despatch of the 7th says: Twenty years ago Ernest Wolf, wife and two children, lived in the south end of this city. The birth of a third child caused the mother to have puerperal mania, and she was sent to an insane asylum, where she has been since. Shortly after putting her in the asylum, the husband left St. Louis, with his children, and located at Holden, Mo., where he took another wife. His children were told that their mother was dead, and never knew any better. Mrs. Wolf was set at liberty five years ago, but could find no trace of her husband. She wandered back to the asylum. Her reason again dethroned, Dr. Legrand Atwood interested himself in the case, and a year ago, when she seemed sufficiently recovered to be sent away, he tried to find her friends. By advertising he attracted the attention of a man at Holden, who wrote to Dr. Atwood, that the woman's husband was now wealthy and living at Holden; that the children were also living there. Dr. Atwood wrote to the son, which letter was the first news that the young man had ever received of the fate of his mother. The brother and sister came to St. Louis and took their mother out of the asylum. Steps have been taken to secure a divorce for Mrs. Wolf and a part of her husband's wealth.
