Probe Effect Of DDT On Salmon In N.B. Streams

OTTAWA (CP)—The fisheries department is attempting to determine whether New Brunswick salmon will be permanently affected by sprays used to kill forest-destroying budworms. Dr. J.L. Kask, chairman of the fisheries research board, said the new research represents an expansion of studies conducted two years ago into the death of young salmon, following forest spraying operations.

Dr. Kask said tests to determine the period water remains toxic are being made by the department's St. Andrews, N.B., fishery research station. Young salmon had been placed in cages in waters polluted with DDT under natural runoff conditions. "We hope that these tests will show how long the DDT affects the fish and whether this effect is temporary or permanent," he said. Tests to determine what concentration of DDT was lethal also were being conducted at St. Andrews. Fish were placed in ponds

to determine what amounts of DDT in streams and rivers were lethal. Dr. Kask said tests to determine the period water remains toxic are being made by the department's St. Andrews, N.B., fishery research station. "We hope that these tests will show how long the DDT affects the fish and whether this effect is temporary or permanent," he said.
