THE GERRYMANDER BILL.

(Continued from page 1.)

Parliament. It is like calling in a doctor after the patient is dead.

THE TORONTO WORLD'S OPINION.

The World says that the Government's pretensions that the bill is absolutely fair and impartial are all sham and humbug. The measure is not an honest one in any sense. The bill was introduced for party purposes pure and simple. It is a political scheme designed to secure an advantage for the Liberal party, and not remedy an abuse. It is on a par with the Liberal party's practices in Ontario to keep Sir Oliver Mowat and Mr. Hardy in power. In spite of Sir Wilfrid's pious protestations, the bill is designed to strengthen his party and not to do justice to the country. The World is confident that so unfair a measure will not become law. "Parliament will never pass it."

WHAT THE GAZETTE SAYS

It will be the duty of Parliament, after the census of 1901, to redistribute the constituencies, so as to give to the newer and most rapidly progressing provinces, and sections of provinces, the greater representation they are entitled to. Till that time comes it is against the spirit of the constitution to change the representation of the people in the House of Commons, either by increasing or decreasing it, or by altering the electoral districts. The British North America Act is specific in its provisions, and its meaning should not be set aside without grave cause. Sir Wilfrid Laurier speaking on the 1st instant, on the proposal to take the census in 1890 instead of 1891, opposed the idea because, he said, he felt very strongly that the constitution should not be lightly amended, because he was strongly of opinion the constitution should not be amended without an overwhelming case—not only a strong case, but an overwhelming case. He, therefore, hoped it should be regarded as a matter of the strictest duty of all Canadians to maintain our constitution so far as it could be maintained in its entirety, and only to amend it when a great wrong would arise were it not amended. If the proposal to vary by one year the time set in the B.N.A. Act for the taking of the census called for such strong language, surely the respect for the constitution that justified him should now prevent the Premier from varying by two years the time set for adjusting the representation of the people in Parliament.

FACTS AND FIGURES FROM MAIL AND EMPIRE.

Assuming that the constitution permitted each party to gerrymander its turn, an exploit of that kind would be excusable only in the event of the previous redistribution having been unfair. The charge of unfairness, however, cannot be laid at the door of Sir John Thompson or of Mr. Costigan, who prepared the last redistribution. Sir John was far above such iniquity, and Mr. Costigan has just received a certificate of character which establishes the correctness of his conduct. But aside from this, the public records show that the arrangement, if it worked unfairly at all, was unfair to the Conservatives. The vote for the Dominion stood thus:

Conservatives.....417,685
Liberals.....392,108
Independents.....55,522
Patrons.....30,965

The minority of the popular vote actually elected a majority to Parliament. For Ontario the figure were these:

Conservatives.....190,910
Liberals.....181,339
Independents.....27,575
Patrons.....17,885

So that 181,339 Liberals elected forty-four members, while the 190,910 Conservatives elected but 45. The element of injustice to the Liberals is therefore wanting, and the pretext for a new redistribution is not to be found.

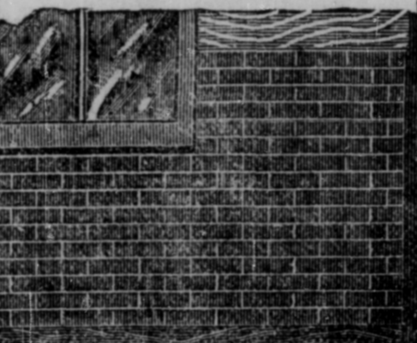

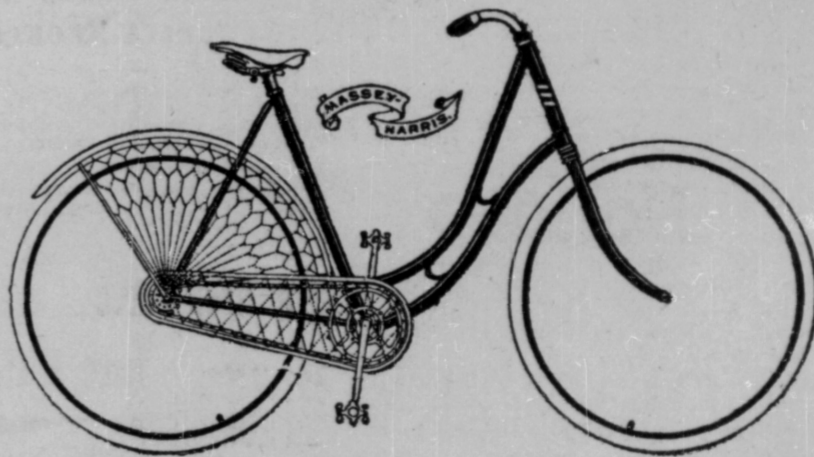
