A Maritime Conference on Adult Education, the first of its nature, will be held at the Fort Cumberland Hotel, Amherst, from June 11 to 13, it was announced today following a special Maritime — Newfoundland committee meeting in Halifax recently.

Attending the Halifax meeting were Dr. J. Roby Kidd, Toronto, associate director of the Canadian Adult Education Association; K. A. Bishop, Teachers' College, Fredericton; C. A. Douglas, extension services division, Department of Agriculture and Marketing, Truro; Charles Toppsee, assistant director of adult education for Nova Scotia, and Guy Henson, director of adult education for Nova Scotia, who was made chairman of the planning committee for the conference.

Other members consulted but unable to attend were Alec Laidlaw, assistant director of extension department, Saint Francis Xavier University, Antigonish; H. B. Chandler, director of libraries and adult education, Prince Edward Island Education Department, and Dr. Florence O'Neill.
