now look at the power of the Gospel to prepare us for the summons: "Set thine house in order; for thou shalt die and not live." Adoniram Judson, a celebrated missionary to India, wrote this of himself and his work: "I am not tired of my work, nor of the world; but if my Father called me I would go like a boy bounding out of school to His arms. Death shall never surprise me." Was not that a wonderful life? It goes far above that of Hezekiah. He went down among the heathen millions of India that might bring up the Saviour forever. No wonder he could say: "Whenever my Father calls me, death will not surprise me." David Livingstone, wasted with his travels, is left alone for a little while by his attendants, and when they return they find him on his knees, but the spirit has fled. He was not afraid to meet death. George MacDonnell, the veteran pioneer missionary of the Methodist Church in the great Northwest, was found dead on his knees on the cold snow of the prairie. He had suffered from the cold; but was he afraid to die? No. That brave man was ready and willing to die at any time. It is a delightful thing for a man to die at his post. Many years ago, a gentleman who was the third pastor of this Church, I am told, and was known by many of you had a son who was trained in your Sabbath School. That son grew up to manhood, went in and out among you, his life was known to most of you, and you knew his record. I was a comparative stranger to our departed brother, and knew him only a few months; but he was one of the first to welcome us to this city, and was always of an amiable and cheerful disposition. He was also constant in his attendance upon all the services of the Church. When he spoke or prayed, he was always hopeful, and his rich, clear voice could easily be distinguished among all the worshippers in singing the songs of Zion. For many years, here and elsewhere, he had filled important offices in the Church, and invariably to the great satisfaction of those with whom he was associated. When the Master called him he was found at the post of duty, in the service of the Government whose official he was—and though no human eye saw him in those last moments, yet this we know, that his removal was so gentle that no sound was heard escaping from the apartment where the Angel of Death met him. There is something very solemn in connection with the suddenness of the call which came to our departed brother, but we believe that in his case "sudden death" was "sudden glory."

"So live that when thy summons comes To join the innumerable caravan, Where each must take his station In the silent halls of death, Thou go not, like the quarry slave, Scourged to his dungeon— But, sustained by an unfaltering trust, Approach thy grave, like him Who wraps the drapery of his couch around him, And lies down to pleasant slumbers."

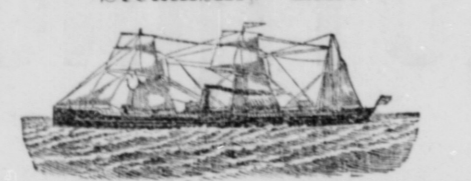

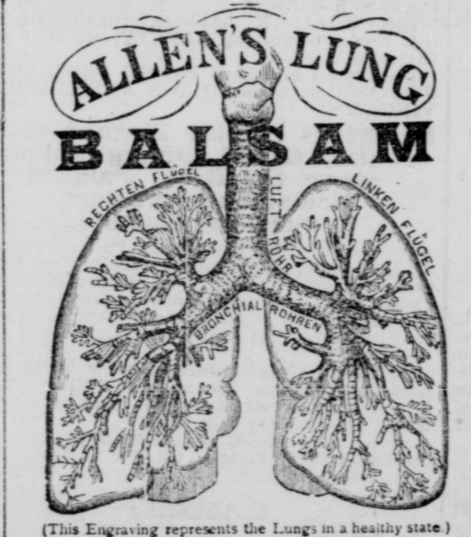
