HALIFAX, 1st February, 1868.

SIR,

I have the honor to inform you that it is intended to hold a Provincial Industrial Exhibition in the City of Halifax during the Second week of October next, at which Prizes to the amount of \$10,000 will be distributed. The competition is limited to Nova Scotian productions, except in the case of Prizes for Models of Vessels, which are open to the world; but the Judges will have the power of granting a limited number of medals, diplomas, or honorary prizes for articles received from other countries; we are therefore desirous of making the Exhibition known beyond the limits of the Province, and with this view, I have forwarded by mail to your address, a number of copies of the Prize list. May I request that you will do us the favor to have these placed into the hands of gentlemen in your Province, who are interested in Agriculture, Arts or Manufactures.
