(Continued from Page 1) any of the immigrants failing to remain in agricultural employment long enough to repay transportation costs would be borne by the Provincial Government concerned.

It is understood that the Nova Scotia Government has already accepted the arrangement. Train fare of the immigrants from the port of entry to inland points would be paid by the Dominion Department of Labor.

There are three or four German farm workers in this Province at present and they have proved quite satisfactory. The few farmers who have heard about the possibilities of obtaining German farm help are reported to be favorable to the plan.

They point out that as a race Germans have a great respect for authority, and a correspondingly high sense of responsibility, and that very few of those selected would fall to carry out their undertaking under the agreement.

At the same time the Provincial Government must weigh the possibilities of facing a considerable financial loss if the immigrants did not live up to their commitments. It's the financial risk involved which is causing the Federal Government to weigh the matter carefully before making any quick decision.
