She was a member of Hazelbrook Baptist Church and W.M.S. and as long as health and strength permitted, was a regular attendant in the House of the Lord, whom she loved and faithfully followed day by day.

She leaves to cherish the memory of a faithful and loving step-mother, four step-children, by a previous marriage of her late husband Layton MacCabe, Sylvan in British Columbia, Harold in Indiana, Reta in California and Ray in Summerville.
