HONG KONG (Reuters)—Communist China entered the field Thursday as a contender for atomic power status. Scientists attending a conference in Peiping, the Chinese capital, were told: 1. An atomic reactor of the heavy water type with a power output of 7,000 kilowatts and a cyclotron producing 25,000,000 volts will be completed in China this year with Soviet help.
