Dandurand Says No Consideration Given To Kennedy

MONTREAL (CP) — Leo Dandurand, president of Montreal Alouettes of the Big Four, said today no consideration has been given to appointment of Gorman Kennedy, well-known Montreal sportsman, to the post of general manager of the professional football team.

Commenting on reports Monday that Kennedy would be named, Dandurand said:

"I don't know how the story started. We have never at any time discussed the possibility of Gorman joining the club and furthermore we have made him no offer."

Kennedy, who resigned recently as sales manager of a Montreal brewery, expressed surprise when informed of his reported appointment.

"I've never considered the possibility nor have I even spoken to any club officials about it. It's simply a wild rumor."

Meanwhile, Michel Normandin, who became an executive director of the club last season and was mentioned in the report about Kennedy as ready to retire, said it was all news to him.

"I imagine I would know something about it if it were true," said Normandin.

Bold Ruler Runs Last At Jamaica

NEW YORK (AP)—The Bohemia Stable's Ambehaving, winner of three big races in New Jersey for horses bred in that state, invaded New York Tuesday and hauled off the \$96,150 Remsen Stakes as the favored Bold Ruler ran dead last in a field of 11 at Jamaica.

Fourth in the recent \$319,310 Garden State Stakes, Ambehaving rushed up in the stretch Tuesday, overtook John A. Morris' Missile near the final sixteenth of a mile, and skipped under the finish line a 2 1/4-length winner.

Missile, who had taken the lead after three quarters of a mile, got second place by a length and a half over Arvilla P. O'Toole's Pindia, who went off at 70-1. The Greentree Stable's Coboes, third choice in the betting at 7-1, finished fourth, a neck back.

Ambehaving, winner of three other stakes this year—the New Jersey Futurity at Monmouth, the Homebred Handicap at Atlantic City, and the New Jersey Breeders Stakes at Garden State Park, was ridden by Logan Batcheller. The winner, a brown son of Ambiorix-Dentrifices paid \$13,600, \$7,100 and \$5,500.

Athletics Sign Harry Simpson

KANSAS CITY (AP) — Kansas City Athletics announced Tuesday that outfielder Harry Simpson, the club's leading hitter, has become the first player to sign his 1957 contract.

Simpson who signed Monday, batted .293, hit 21 home runs and led the A's in runs batted in with 105.

Ace Marine And Champ To Meet

TORONTO (CP)—Ace Marine and Canadian Champ will meet for the first time Saturday in the running of the \$15,000 Durham Cup Stakes at New Woodbine.

Ace Marine was voted Canada's "horse of the year" in 1955. Canadian Champ is virtually certain of winning the same award in 1956. Ace Marine, a four-year-old, Champ whose activities have been confined almost exclusively to events for three-year-olds.

Hasn't Heard From Leafs Since Protest Filed

MONTREAL (CP) — President Clarence Campbell of the National Hockey League said Tuesday he has heard nothing from Toronto Maple Leafs since they filed notice of protest by wire over disallowance of a goal in a game last Saturday night.

Campbell said he telegraphed back to the Leafs Sunday asking them to supply proof and other necessary information. He also asked the Detroit Red Wings if they acknowledged or denied the validity of the Toronto claim. He has not heard from Detroit.

The disputed goal, disallowed by the referee, was scored as the game ended. The Leafs claimed the puck entered the net "in time," just before the goal light flashed and siren sounded. The Red Wings claimed it didn't. The goal, if allowed, would have given the Leafs a 2-2 tie with the Wings.

Big 4 Returns To Old Method Of Kicking Converts

OTTAWA (CP)—The Big Four Football League is going back to the old way of kicking converts—from the 10-yard line into the end zone—for league playoffs.

Big Four president James P. McCaffrey said Tuesday the change was made because there is too much at stake in the playoffs. "There have been reports of the crowds in the end zones throwing things at the man trying the convert," he said.

Midway in the season, Big Four clubs agreed to kick converts from 10 yards behind the goal line towards the playing area because fans in end zone bleachers gathered in kicked footballs and refused to give them up.

The first playoff game is today's sudden-death semi-final in Hamilton between the Tiger-Cats and Ottawa Rough Riders. The winner will meet Montreal Alouettes in a home-and-home total points series starting in either Ottawa or Hamilton Saturday. The second game will be played in Montreal Nov. 17.

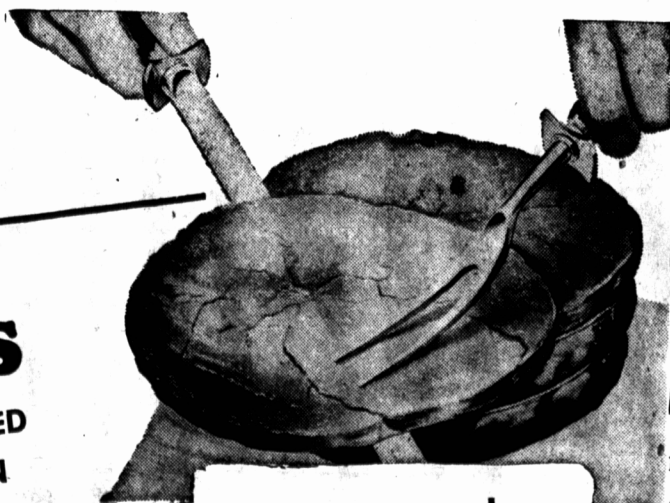
