Canadian Sugar Prices Said Not Out Of Line

(OTTAWA CP) — Canadian refined sugar prices have risen less than the world price for raw sugar, Justice Minister Chevrier said in the Commons Thursday.

Mr. Chevrier said the sugar shortage was caused by crop shortages in both beet and cane sugar and Canadian consumer prices were not out of line with raw sugar prices.

In what observers called the strongest speech yet to the African summit conference, Obote urged his country as a "training ground" for troops to overthrow white governments on the continent and pleaded with his fellow leaders for African unity.

His attack on United States racial segregation came in an "open letter" to President Kennedy.
