Wants Transport Bd. To Regulate Gas Industry

TORONTO (CP) — A natural gas company Thursday suggested the Board of Transport Commissioners should be authorized to act temporarily as a national energy board to regulate the natural gas industry. General manager D. P. McDonald of Westcoast Transmission Company told the Borden commission on energy such a move would avoid delay in clarifying government policy on exporting gas. Westcoast president Frank M. McMahon told the hearings that the lack of a firm export policy hinders exploration for reserves. Westcoast said in its view, the national energy board should not deal with the regulation or control of production, wellhead or field prices, transportation within province or ultimate price to consumers. A federal energy commission's

power to fix prices in Canada should be limited to purposes of reviewing sales contracts between pipeline and distributing companies and fixing, after hearings, such rate charges, terms and conditions of service.

Mr. McMahon said he is "not happy" with the 22-cent price for each 1,000 cubic feet Westcoast supplies to Pacific Northwest Pipeline Corporation, which supplies the U.S. northwest.

He said there is little he can do about his dissatisfaction. Westcoast entered into a 20-year contract with Pacific Northwest. The contract enabled Westcoast to build a 650-mile pipeline from the Peace River area in Alberta to Vancouver.

"Why don't you just go to them and tell them you want more money?" asked J. J. Frawley of Ottawa, counsel for the Alberta government, which criticized the 22-cent price compared with the 32 to 34 cents paid by British Columbia Electric Company.

"We should be getting more," said Mr. McMahon. But it was the best contract we would make at the time.

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Senate has approved renewal of a law authorizing the Maine Highway Commission to construct and operate a free bridge between Lubec, Me., and Campobello Island, N.B.

The original act required that construction of the bridge begin within one year and be completed within three years of the date of passage. The time limits were not met.

The new bill, introduced by Senator Margaret Chase Smith (Rep. Maine) specifies that construction must start by Dec. 31, 1960, and be completed by Dec. 31, 1961.

No federal costs are involved.

OTTAWA (CP) — Opposition Leader Pearson said Thursday night the Progressive Conservative government is a captive of 1957 election promises that have led to a budget deficit which

OTTAWA (CP) — Canadian wheat exports overseas increased by 21 per cent in the period from Aug. 1, 1957 to July 2, 1958, the bureau of statistics said Thursday. Exports in the period totaled 246,940,000 bushels compared to 204,504,000 in the previous 12 months. Shipments fell 19 per cent in the week ended July 2 to 5,001,000 bushels from 6,165,000 in the corresponding week last year.
