Thus, there grows up a belief that any departure from the status quo is Russian-inspired, and must be throttled.

It is said of the late President Roosevelt that he was "a little left of centre". If history teaches anything at all, it teaches that many of the world's greatest statesmen were somewhere in that same vicinity. Extreme rightism is chaos; extreme leftism is stagnation. Somewhere in between these two extremes must lie the ideal mixture of sanity and progress.

Another evil springing from the fear of Communism lies in the fact that in our country, legislation, or the absence of legislation, which reflects reactionary influences, and the suppression of liberties, are considered no great cause of concern when compared to the ruthless trampling of freedoms in countries such as Russia and her satellites. "Be thankful you don't live under Soviet control" is the natural feeling, and no doubt we all should be. But the comparison tends to stifle our fight against lesser evils in our own lands.
